A Time of Giving Back at WSUMC

Spring seems to have sprung, and there seems to be a light at the end of the tunnel in regards to COVID-19. God is good!

WSUMC members continue to give back to our community. Three groups are soliciting donations to help several different groups who are in need.

The Missions Team is currently asking for donations of healthy snacks for the students and teachers at Alcorn Middle School. Suggested items include granola bars, individual packets of nuts, cereal, fruit, protein shakes, shelf-stable milk, crackers with cheese, and Powerade. These items will be collected through April 30.

We know you've got some of those clothes you outgrew during the pandemic, so now is the time to do some spring cleaning and bring those gently used clothes for the Active Faith PTSA First Year Teachers Closet (to benefit Alcorn Middle School teachers). Both men's and women's clothing are needed. There is a special request for men's pants 30-32; coats 38-40; and shirts (small; 15 or 151/2). You may drop your donation off at the Traxler classroom on the 2nd floor of the church. The drive will continue through April 30.





The Sunday Dinner Team is also collecting prepackaged food items for the attendees of the upcoming Sunday "Brunch" on the Grounds. Traditionally known as Sunday Dinner, the March event will be a brunch held to feed those who are experiencing food insecurity in our community. The event will be held from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm on Sunday, March 28 in the parking lot of the church. Two minority-owned businesses will be serving our guests. The Coffee Queen (Denean Ambersley) will bring her food truck and will serve drinks and pastries, and Kiki's Chicken & Waffles will bring their truck and will be serving their signature menu item.

We are also asking for donations of snack items for our guests. We ask that you bring individually wrapped snack items, pop-top prepared foods, and other nonperishable food that does not require cooking to the church no later than March 26. 
Palm Sunday Parade! Attention Parents!

"Brunch" on the Grounds Announced

The Sunday Dinner Mission team of Washington Street United Methodist Church (WSUMC) will hold a socially-distanced, Sunday "Brunch" on the Grounds on Sunday, March 28 from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm in the parking lot of the church. A pre-prepared, pre-packed take-away (or sit-down) brunch will be served to any in need in our community. Two popular, minority-owned businesses will bring their food trucks to the church and will be serving the meal. The Coffee Queen (Denean Ambersley), and Kiki's Chicken & Waffles have partnered with WSUMC in this endeavor.

Volunteers from WSUMC, Heyward Street UMC, along with several community volunteers will help distribute the meals in a responsible, socially-distanced manner. Tables will be set up for those who wish to sit and eat, and these tables will be distanced at least 6 ft apart. Masks and social distancing will be required by all in attendance. CAN Community Health, a nonprofit agency that provides HIV and Hepatitis C prevention and treatment to under-served populations will be on hand to provide testing and blood pressure screening.

This mission, normally known in the community as the

Sunday Dinner, is an outreach of the Sunday Dinner Mission Team of WSUMC. The outbreak of COVID-19 has caused the team to look

at a different way of focusing on the needs of those experiencing hard times and homelessness. Normally, all participants, volunteers, and guests, would come together for a meal served family-style at tables in the church's Threatt Hall. With COVID-19 still a threat to our





community, the team recognized the need to rethink its structure to safely continue its mission. Thanks to a discretionary grant from Richland County, WSUMC will be able to continue its mission throughout 2021. WSUMC hopes that in the near future they can return to their original, in-person Sunday Dinners. The team plans to hold several other "Dinners" in 2021.
