
August "Come Together" Series Drawing to a Close


Getting to Know

If so, or if that sounds interesting to you, we would like to invite you to a unique opportunity for experiencing intimacy with God. After all, we all yearn for a deeper relationship with Christ. Reverend Alston Lippert is offering to lead interested individuals in this journey.

Companions in Christ is a spiritual formation group that will provide ways and paths for you to grow closer to God. It is a 28-week journey of five parts that helps participants deepen their relationship with God. The five parts are:



• Embracing the Journey: The way of Christ

An exploration of spiritual formation as a journey toward wholeness and holiness, individually and in community, through the grace of God.

 An introduction to several ways of meditating and praying with scripture.
- Deepening our Prayer: The heart of Christ A guided experience of various classic forms and styles of prayer.
- Responding to Our Call: The work of Christ


A presentation of gifts and call, giving ourselves to God in willing obedience, and receiving the fruits and gifts of the Holy Spirit.

THE DAWSEY CLASS: This Sunday, the Rev. Tom Wall will lead a discussion of Chapter 7, "The Shadow-Bearers," in *Holy Envy: Finding God in the Faith of Others* by Barbara Brown Taylor. On August 25, the Rev. Joe Slade will teach Chapter 8, "Failing Christianity."

THE PAUL HARMON CLASS: The Paul Harmon Class is a bible study group that has been blessed to have retired Methodist minister Don Britt teaching lessons on the minor prophets. He will continue the study Sept. 8-Oct. 20, then will teach Advent lessons based on the prophet Isaiah during the month of December. Visitors are welcome to join the class to hear this marvelous teacher!

THE OPEN DOOR CLASS is continuing its tour through Old Testament Stories from the Backside. On August 18 and 25, we will be looking at two lesser known stories about king David. Join us to delve into these stories and learn what these messages have for our daily lives.
