WSUMC Responds After Vandalism

In the early morning of April 14, WSUMC's Black Lives Matter banner was vandalized. It had been placed on the fence facing Bull Street to celebrate Black History Month in February.

With the recent racial unrest, the RJAT (Racial Justice Action Team) decided to leave the banner up to show its support of the movement sweeping our country as injustices continue to make headlines. The banner was cut, partially taking out some of the word "black" in the statement "All Lives Can't Matter Until Black Lives Matter." The incident was caught on cameras that

face the parking lot, although the image was blurry.

Pastor Parrish, along with Nancy Whittle, facilitator for the WSUMC Racial Justice Action Team spoke out about the incident in recent videos which can be viewed online on the WSUMC Facebook page and on the WSUMC website at wsmethodist.gog/response-to-recent-vandalism-of-blm-banner/

Chair of Church Council, Ricky Rowe responded in a written statement to members of Church Council about the incident. "This is the first time that WSUMC has seen any of our social justice banners vandalized. Thankfully, video from our church cameras has given us some additional information on who was involved and will be used to address the situation. While the actions taken by the individual on the morning of the 14th are extremely disappointing, it will not deter Washington Street UMC from being a vocal leader in the community on issues of social justice."

A replacement banner has arrived and has been rehung on the Bull St. fence.




