Sunday School ... Growing in Christ together

A core part of our Baptismal Covenant is our promise to nurture one another in the Christian faith and life. Our Sunday School classes for children and adults offers our congregation the opportunity to fulfill that promise.

THE ALDERSGATE CLASS: This past Sunday, David Anderson led an interesting discussion about evolution versus biblical creation as part of the Adam Hamilton series *Confronting the Controversies*. Next Sunday, the topic will be the death penalty, and following a brief Hamilton lecture on DVD, Hal Hanlin will lead the discussion, which is expected to be spirited and lively. (A safe prediction, don't you think?) The following Sunday, the Hamilton issue will be a discussion of euthanasia.

The Dawsey Class: Is starting a new book, *The Universal Christ: How a Forgotten Reality Can Change Everything We See, Hope For and Believe* by Richard Rohr. On April 28, the Rev. Tom Summers will lead a discussion of the Introduction and Chapter 1, "Christ Is Not Jesus's Last Name." On May 5, the Rev. Joe Slade will present Chapter 2, "Accepting That You Are Fully Accepted," and Chapter 3, "Revealed in Us — as Us."

THE GRACE CLASS: April 28 the class will cover the last chapter of the book *Easter Earthquake*; May 5, Tom Wall and MSN students will share about their mission trip to Ecuador; May 12 the class will start *Painting the Stars*, *Science*, *Religion and an Evolving Faith* from the Living the Questions series. It will run 7-8 weeks.

THE JOHN HARPER CLASS: They will be using passages from Romans focusing on the spread of the Gospel.

THE JOY CLASS: They will be continuing their lesson series on the text, *Simon Peter: Flawed by Faithful Disciple*, by Adam Hamilton.

THE OPEN DOOR CLASS: The Open Door Class will begin a new study on May 5. *If: Trading Your If Only Regrets for God's What If Possibilities* by Mark Batterson will guide us through Romans chapter 8. Join us to free yourself from "if only..." and think "what if...?" as we study together.

THE PAUL HARMON CLASS: On April 28 we will resume our study of Genesis. On May 19, Reverend Don Britt will begin a series of lessons on the minor prophets. We will begin with Amos. Please join us.

Answers to questions you may not have asked ...

- *Yes* we know that the dogwood tree in the parking lot failed to come to life this spring. If it hasn't been removed already, it will be soon. When that spot is ready for a new tree, one will be planted.
- *Yes* it is true. We have talked about renovating the first-floor restrooms for some time now. We have one bid in hand and will hopefully have a new family and ADA-accessible restroom completed by the end of summer, with the main womens' and mens' upgraded soon afterwards. Marshall Colcord is coordinating these projects for the Trustees.
- *Yes* you may have noticed that the sanctuary area under the balcony is not as dark as it once was thanks to some brighter LED lights. Mike Conte is the trustee coordinator for a lighting upgrade that will include the hallways between the Wesley Room and the sanctuary.

We are also exploring options for re-landscaping the Marion and Washington Street areas. Karen Carr and Janet Cotter are coordinating these efforts for the trustees.

Finally, the trustees are reviewing a comprehensive security audit that was completed in 2018. We will start to implement phases of that — hopefully toward the end of the year.

Getting to Know

Jane Peterson

ane Peterson, our new communications specialist, earned a Bachelor's degree in theatre from the University of South Carolina, and she even married her husband Charlie on the stage at the original Trustus Theatre on Assembly Street.

But most of her jobs, over the years, have been in marketing and graphic design.

The Peterson family are members of Washington Street and attended regularly for four or five years during the tenure of the Rev. Dr. Mike Alexander, the senior minister. Jane and Charlie were members of the Aldersgate Class, and Jane designed the double-spiral Bicentennial Cookbook in collaboration with Mary Lide, who acted as editor and sent her the files to work with.

"I still use mine all the time," she said.

Jane's mother-in-law is longtime WSUMC member Nelle Peterson, and Nelle's friend Ralph Barrett "was almost like my boys' grandfather," Jane said.

Jane and Charlie live in Irmo, and as their older son Chipper started playing football for Irmo through middle and high school, they attended Union United Methodist Church.

Jane's most recent job was as director of marketing for the Fine Arts Center of Kershaw County in Camden, where she worked for eight years.

"There were almost 100 events a year, plus classes," she said. "I got burned out." Plus she had a 40-mile commute each way.

Jane said she has been acting on stage since she was 12 and thought she might teach acting when she majored in theatre at USC. Charlie also was a theatre major, and they got to know each other when they were in the same play. They were friends for several years before they started dating in 1984 and married in 1986.

Jane has been in a lot of local productions, and until about five years ago, she and Charlie did a couple of summer stock plays each year at the Abbeville Opera House.

In college and after, she held a number of jobs. She sold real estate, worked part time for *The Gamecock* newspaper setting type, did graphic design for the now-defunct

Columbia Review magazine and worked at the House of Fabrics on Main Street.

For almost 20 years, Jane worked for the National Association for Campus Activities (NACA), a non-profit organization that works with 2,500 to 3,000 colleges in the United States and Canada to book lectures, bands, comedians, dance companies and other programs on their



campuses. The association was formed in 1967 after a meeting in Columbia. Its first national office was at USC; today it is headquartered in Harbison, Jane said.

She worked with performers and their agents, designed marketing materials and was involved in planning the NACA annual conventions. Jane attended that convention and two regional conferences each year. Her biggest client was MTV.

Charlie owns and operates Harvest Talent as a talent agent, booking actors in films, television and training films. They have owned Harvest since 1988.

Jane and Charlie have two sons, Chip – a nickname for Charles Haywood Peterson Jr., 30, and Chris, 24. Chip lives in Atlanta with his wife Rachael. Chris lives in Lexington and is a supervisor at the newest Starbucks located off I-26 in Irmo. Because Chris doesn't regularly drink coffee, Jane and her husband are the recipients of a free pound of coffee each week from Chris, a "perk" of employment with Starbucks.

Jane started working at Washington Street on April 8, "So far everybody I've met has been great," she said. "I'm still trying to feel my way through it. I will give myself a month, I think I'll have a pretty good handle on everything."

Jane likes to swim when she can, travel, spend time with family, and sometimes buys and resells small collectibles. She loves to read fiction and murder mysteries; the last book she read was *The Beantown Girls* by Jane Healey.
