THE OPEN DOOR CLASS: This Sunday, September 15, The Open Door Class will complete it's study of *Old Testament Stories from the Backside* by J. Ellsworth Kalas. 

Getting to Know Jenias Means

hen Jenais Means was looking for a church, she made a list of what she wanted.

An early service so she could seize the rest of her day. A traditional, predictable order of worship. A church willing to think about and discuss how to include everybody.

She planned to visit a different church every Sunday, and said, "I was concerned I was going to be visiting churches for years."

Washington Street was the second church Jenais visited. She checked off the first two things on her list, and she saw hints of progressiveness. It seemed as though no one thought it odd that she was an African American attending a predominantly white church, and she was invited to attend two Sunday school classes.

The next Sunday she visited the Open Door Class and the following Sunday the Grace Class. She was drawn to the Grace Class because of its controversial discussion topics.

"This is definitely progressive," she said. "There are people here who are willing to tackle the tough stuff."

Since that first visit in February 2018, Jenais has become involved in several areas at Washington Street.

She loves being a table companion at our Sunday Dinners for the homeless and working poor.

"I loved the concept of

having dinner for our guests – doing things with people rather than for people," Jenais said. "I believe that Jesus came to alleviate the burdens of and serve the poor and oppressed. The Sunday Dinners really feel like that."

Jenais said she was humbled when Alston asked her to be a circle leader during the four sessions held to discern if Washington Street should become a member of the Reconciling Ministries Network, a nonprofit organization that promotes the full inclusion of people of all sexual orientations and gender identities in the life of the church.

And beginning Tuesday, Jenais will lead a small group – Belong – that aims to provide participants with group spiritual direction.

Jenais grew up in Columbia and went to African Methodist Episcopal churches with her mother and to First Nazareth Baptist Church with her father. She graduated from Richland Northeast High School in 2003 and from Xavier University in New Orleans in 2007, where she majored in biology and minored in chemistry.

Growing up, Jenais always knew that she would help people heal and save lives. Her parents interpreted that as a career in medicine and Jenais started preparing to be a trauma surgeon. She did not think more deeply or pray about it. She selected Xavier because it was the number-

one college in placing African Americans in medical school.

But after taking the Medical College Admissions Test and not gaining entrance into the medical schools she applied for, Jenais thought medicine was not in her path.

Looking back on her life since college, Jenais realizes she has been going through a discernment process.

"It really was a God-led thing, not a Jenais thing," she said. "God was giving me clear directions, and once I let go of all the 'I want this' and 'I need that' and yielded to 'whatever is your will for me Lord,' the path became clear, the instructions became clear and the opportunities made themselves known to me."

Jenais resisted God's calling to the ministry for years.

"I thought, 'What? I'm not a minister. I'm not a preacher,' " Jenais said. But she kept reading her Bible and praying, and she practiced a kind of fast, which involved abstaining "from all processed, ready-made foods, all diningout foods."

When her grandfather was dying, he put her in charge of their family, and when they shook on that agreement, she heard her call to the ministry in a way she couldn't ignore.

"I began to understand that God had a plan for me that was greater than anything I could imagine," she said.

In May of 2013, she stood before the congregation of Bethel AME Church and accepted her calling to the



ministry. For the first time on this spiritual journey, she felt calm.

In the meantime, Jenais had been using the subjects of her undergraduate major to teach the science labs at Midlands Technical College. Although God gave her some next steps, she continued teaching these classes until 2018.

Soon after she publicly accepted her calling, God gave Jenais her next set of instructions: go back to school. Over the years, Jenais has learned not to avoid the call of the Spirit, but to respond as soon as it is clear.

She was directed into the master's in clinical mental health counseling program at Lenoir Rhyne University, Columbia campus, and today she has her own counseling practice where clients range in age from 4 to 78. Jenais also is working on a spiritual direction certification at the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary and planning to apply to Ph.D. programs related to

counseling education or counseling supervision.

God instructed Jenais to resign from her job at MTC, which made her eligible for a grant position weeks later at the Department of Mental Health, supervising crisis counselors who went door-to-door in eight counties hit by Hurricane Florence.

Jenais enjoys hanging out with her four nieces and two nephews. Recently, she took her nieces shopping, and because she told them her radio was broken, they sang all the way from Blythewood to Harbison.

Jenais also likes to go out with friends; they call it GOLF – Girls Out Living Freely.

It usually involves wine, she said, and takes place at a restaurant in the Vista or on Main Street.




Small Groups Fall 2019


