# Sunday School Classes

## What are they studying?

Several of our adult Sunday School classes just started new studies, and others are wrapping up previous ones. Looking for a place to go this Sunday morning? New friends are always welcome!

THE ALDERSGATE CLASS: On Sunday, April 25th, Elaine Moses will begin to teach a series from the text, Happiness is a Serious Problem, by Dennis Prager.

THE GRACE CLASS: Rev. John Evans from the Dawsey Class will lead the Grace Class from April 8th until April 25th on a series of pertinent topics from Walter Wink's book, The Powers That Be: Theology for a New Millennium. Topics for those three weeks are: Understanding Domination System (power, how it is exercised and what it sanctions actively or passively), Jesus the Third Way (focusing on how Jesus responded to power and violence) and, The Gift of the Enemy (how do we find God in our enemy?). THE JOHN HARPER CLASS: Using New Testament readings, their focus in April is Luke, John, and Revelations. Join them for a spirited discussion.

THE JOY CLASS: Following Easter, they will begin a study on Adam Hamilton's text, The Call: The Life and Message of the Apostle Paul.

THE OPEN DOOR CLASS: On April 15th, they will begin a new study of John Ortberg's text, All the Places to Go - How Will You Know? This six-week study will help everyone recognize divine opportunities in daily life, overcome the fear of missing out or making the wrong choice, and walk through open doors with confidence.

THE PAUL HARMON CLASS: On May 6, the Paul Harmon Class will begin a study of, This We Believe: The Core of Wesleyan Faith and Practice, by William H. Willimon.



College students often find themselves too young for adult Sunday school classes, but have outgrown the Youth Ministry. Young adults 1-2 years out of college graduation are in a place where they're too old for college ministries, yet some ironically find themselves not "old enough" for the typical young adult ministry. So where do they go?

# The Purple Heart Bus

If you see a purple – as in Purple Heart – bus traveling the roads of the Midlands, look right behind the back wheel on the driver's side. You will see a picture of Paul McClanahan, a member of Washington Street.

The bus features pictures of 20 Purple Heart recipients and proclaims, "The Midlands .... A Purple Heart Community." The Purple Heart is a United States military decoration awarded in the name of the president to personnel wounded or killed while serving with the U.S. military.

Today, the Purple Heart is a heart-shaped medallion containing a gold-colored profile of George Washington. In 1782, when he was commander-in-chief of the Continental Army, Washington established the original Purple Heart, designated as the Badge of Military Merit.

Paul was wounded on December 21, 1967, 16 days after he arrived in Vietnam. He was waiting for a bus to go to his job as a civil engineer.

"Somebody threw a grenade out of a vehicle," Paul said. His foot was badly injured, and doctors placed more than 200 stainless steel stitches on his legs where he had been wounded by shrapnel.

The 26-year-old Air Force first lieutenant spent time in hospitals in Vietnam and Japan, where a couple of bones in his foot were fused to repair nerve damage that caused foot drop.

After that, Paul returned to Tan Son Nhut Air Force Base, where he designed numerous buildings needed as the war rapidly escalated.

In 2015, Paul became active in the Military Order of the Purple Heart – or MOPH – a congressionally chartered organization that has units across the nation. Paul and about 20 other Purple Heart recipients attend monthly meetings at the American Legion on Pickens Street.

MOPH members visit Purple Heart recipients at the VA Hospital and recently attended a funeral at Fort Jackson for a homeless Purple Heart recipient. They also provide a safe environment for Purple Heart recipients to talk about their war experiences.

The group's Americanization subcommittee is "kind of the public relations department for the MOPH," Paul said. It has accomplished many projects over the years. Among them: requesting that the state Department of Transportation designate I-20 as an honorary Purple Heart highway, establishing scholarships for the children and grandchildren of Purple Heart recipients and giving leadership awards to ROTC and junior ROTC students.

The Purple Heart COMET bus was one of the Americanization program's projects. The MOPH commander told members where and when photos would be taken for the bus, and Paul showed up for that picture session. The City of Columbia, Richland County and Lexington County paid for the vinyl wrap that was put on the bus.

The bus travels throughout the Midlands, Paul said. He and Beverly recently saw it on Bush River Road, near I-20.

The McClanahans joined Washington Street in 1978. Their children, Carol and Patrick, grew up in the church.
