My vision for worship is that every person who gathers to worship with Washington Street encounters the Living God revealed to us in Jesus Christ. Renewing and revitalizing worship means using the full range of hymnody, creeds, and prayers that are available to us as well as creating visual images that capture our imaginations. We want to engage the whole person and all of their senses in the art of worship. The challenge is to maintain a balance between what feels so familiar and what feels fresh and new and is inviting and appealing to those who are seeking a church home where they can worship and serve God. I am convinced that we are an amazing church family where God's love and compassion is lived out within our congregation and is extended to our community and to our world. I am happy to share in this ministry with you!

When Lainey Wood first heard about Washington Street's Renewal 2020 plan, she thought it was exciting. As a communication studies junior at Columbia College, Lainey heard about it from Jim Lane, an education professor at the college and a member of Washington Street.

The church's business administrator, Robbie Douglas, met Lainey on campus and later after the pieces fell into place, she began as the Communication Intern. She started working 25 hours a week in May 2016 and became our full-time communication specialist after graduation this year.

Lainey has worked on the Washington Street website, our social media and created Engage Washington to keep everyone connected.

This summer, Lainey launched The Connection, and it is allowing her to explore every aspect of the church.

Lainey grew up in Shandon United Methodist Church, where her grandfather was a minister. She still teaches the sixth-grade Sunday School class with her dad and works with the youth there. Her mother, Lesli, is Director of Christian Education at Shandon. "It wasn't a surprise to anybody when I took a job in a Methodist church," she said, laughing.

Lainey has an older sister, Kristen, who teaches fourth grade and a brother, Kevin, who is 18. Her father, Stan, heads the outdoor program at Heathwood Hall (think scuba diving and mountain climbing).

Outside of church, Lainey loves to spend time with family and friends. She said she has become an "exercise junkie," taking a group fitness class almost every day.

Washington Street's missions and ministry makes her want to share them, she said. "Working in a church that has shown me how to be the hands and feet of Christ makes me want to show others how to be the hands and feet of Christ," she said.
