Advent is always an exciting time in the life of the church as we prepare our hearts and minds for the arrival of Jesus, who we know as Emmanuel, God with us. The season of Advent also begins a new year in the Church year cycle, so there is a sense of hope and renewal during this season as well.

I am especially excited this Advent and Christmas season because I am able to combine two of my passions: working with children and youth and planning creative worship. I am thrilled that our children and youth are actively involved in worship leadership during all of our Advent services. We had youth and children assist with the

Hanging of the Greens service on December 2nd and two youth, Ansley Jansen and Madison Matthews, served as readers during our December 9th Lessons and Carols service. We also look forward to over 30 children and youth participating in our annual Children's Nativity on December 16th. Some will lead as part of the Nativity cast, while others will shine in their roles as Stage Managers and Costumers. In addition, on December 23rd, eight of our youth will provide a scripted reading of the Annunciation, when the Angel Gabriel appeared to Mary to announce that she would bear God's son.

It is always exciting when our children and youth lead us in our worship of God. However, I think it is especially captivating to see our youngest lead us during this season as we remember the words of Isaiah's vision of the Peaceable Kingdom when "a little child will lead them" (Isaiah 11:6). And the Savior of the world came to us, not as a mighty and powerful King, but as an innocent child. HEIFER INTERNATIONAL LIVING GIFT MARKET: What's the buzz?!
This Sunday, December 16th, is the last day of Washington Street's
Living Gift Market. Finish your Christmas shopping today by giving
the gift of hope to struggling families around the world. Your symbolic gift of an animal
and its care can provide food and income. The gifts from Washington Street's market
will be used to help fund two Heifer programs in Ecuador this year that are listed
below. MOOEY CHRISTMAS!!!

PACHA - CAMELID PROGRAM

This program includes families in Ecuador, Peru, and Boliva. The program will run from 2014-2024 and will involve 96,000 families. Local municipalities and ministries of agriculture are co-funding this project. For an indigenous farmer or artisan in the Andean region, alpaca, llama, and vicuna production are vital to survival, but due to climate change, agriculture has new challenges. The PACHA program brings new sustainable farming models plus the critical component of reliable market access so that farmers and artisans have a market to sell their meats and other goods, moving these families from simply surviving to thriving.

GANASOL AGRICULTURE & LIVESTOCK PROGRAM

The GANASOL program supports small-scale farming, indigenous and afro-descendant populations in order to increase the competitiveness of their agricultural production, ensure their food security and increase their interaction with local and broader markets. All of this is done under conditions that make it possible to generate reasonable profits for all involved in value chains, such as basic grains, poultry and guinea pigs, goat, swine, quinoa, amaranth, beans, native potatoes, fruits and agroecological produce. This program is located in Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, Ecuador, Peru, Boliva, and Mexico. The number of families to be helped is 696,000. The duration of the program is from 2014-2024. Funding partners for the Ganasol program are the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, GEF, and Solidaridad Network.

Church-Wide Advent Series



From the Records and History Committee



75 YEARS AGO

During the World War II holiday seasons, there was a shortage of rooms available in the Columbia area for those who wished to visit their loved ones stationed at Fort Jackson. This problem was addressed in the church bulletin for December 19, 1943.

"THINK AGAIN

Many fine men in uniform have had to ask their mothers, sweethearts or wives to 'wait until I can find a room before you leave to spend Christmas with me.' Your minister [Rev. J. Owen Smith] has no desire to carry the church outside its special field. He simply reminds you that the situation is serious; that one phase of the Christmas message is hospitable goodwill; that a fellow who remarks 'I haven't seen my wife in eight months' deserves if possible a place for her to stay. Think again about that spare room in your home!"
