The Africa University Choir, composed of students from six African countries, will appear in worship with Dr. Jim Salley on <u>Wednesday, February 21st at 6:30 PM in our Sanctuary.</u>

Africa University, located at Old Mutare, Zimbabwe, enrolled its first class of 40 students in 1992. Currently, there are just under 1,200 full-time students from 25 African countries enrolled at the university. The university is a United Methodist-related institution and is intended to serve the entire continent of Africa.

The 16-member choir is under the direction of Mr. Tendekai Kuture. The choir will give a lively performance using several African musical traditions. Invite your friends to join us for an inspiring evening of music, which will send you away with a new spirit!

# Getting to Know Rick & Deborah Rowe

The Active Faith Small Group started after a couple of Sunday school lessons Deborah Rowe taught in the Aldersgate Class. One was on John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, and the other was on Dorcas, a woman in Acts who was devoted to good works and acts of charity.

A little later, Deborah, her husband Rick and Sam Waldrep were talking about their desire to take "the gifts God gave us and use those gifts in service to others" as Wesley and Dorcas had done, Deborah said. They wanted to do more than just sit and listen. "We wanted to do things."

Then, Deborah asked the Rev. Patricia Parrish, Washington Street's senior minister, how to bring about what the three had discussed. Patricia suggested that they form a small group.

The Rowes set the first meeting for a Sunday afternoon at their Vista condominium, but as the date drew near, Deborah became a little anxious.

"I was praying, 'What are we going to do? What are we going to do?' " she said. But at that first meeting in mid-June of 2017, the ideas started flowing from the group of seven.

Their first project was Hand y Mano, a two-week Vacation Bible School for refugee children held at Virginia Wingard UMC, in cooperation with Lutheran Family Services. Next, they had water bottles made for the Soup Cellar clients, and they placed a water station outside the church office.

Then, there was a blanket ministry, an umbrella ministry and Christmas gift bags for the children of Soup Cellar clients. The group took flower arrangements to hospitalized evacuees from Puerto Rico and recently planted a greenery garden to provide foliage for future flower arrangements.

Future projects include Easter baskets for the children of Soup Cellar clients, to be created with Mary's Maidens, and a yard sale, scheduled for April 14th, to raise money to pay for Active Faith Small Group projects.

Members of the Active Faith Small Group include the original seven, founders Rick, Deborah and Sam; and Martha Boynton, Kay Ayers-Garren, Charles Garren and Beverly McClanahan. Carol Fowler, Jim Lane and Kathy Wright joined the group later.

"We've done neat stuff. We have fun. We hope others will join us," Deborah said.

Rick and Deborah Rowe do many things together. They attend and occasionally teach in the same Sunday school class, first the Aldersgate Class and now the Grace Class. Both volunteer in the Soup Cellar. Both are delegates to Annual Conference.

"We're kinda a team," Deborah said. "We stay kinda busy."

Deborah grew up near Walterboro, and Rick grew up on a dairy farm in east Tennessee.

They both married others. She had two daughters, and he had a son, Ricky, who is a member of Washington Street. But, they refer to their children and grandchildren as "our children" and "our grandchildren." They joined Washington Street in 2007 to be with Ricky and his family.

Deborah and Rick met when they worked at the S.C. Department of Health and Environmental Control. They married in 1984. In 1989, they moved to Raleigh, N.C., where he was the director of the Division of Environmental Health within the N.C. Department of Environment, Health and Natural Resources, and she was director of the North Carolina Public Health Association.

Of course, the Rowes haven't worked together in everything they do at Washington Street. They also have individual interests outside of church. They entertain frequently, and Deborah especially likes planning the meals and "having people over, where you're not fighting the noise of a restaurant and can laugh and talk and share things."

Rick likes to read history and historical fiction. He is reading "The River of Doubt: Theodore Roosevelt's Darkest Journey" and finishing a series on Hitler.

But their favorite activity outside of church is travel. They plan their trips a year in advance. Trips scheduled for the rest of this year include Panama City, Fla. in March; Portland and Bend, Ore. in August; the Utah national parks in September and Hilton Head in September and November

They have had a timeshare 20 miles from Honolulu, Hawaii, for 16 years and a timeshare at Hilton Head since 2000.





What are they studying?

Several of our adult Sunday School classes just started new studies, and others are wrapping up previous ones. Looking for place to go this Sunday morning? New friends are always welcome!

THE ALDERSGATE CLASS: Beginning Feb 18th through March 25th, David Anderson will lead discussions on Adam Hamilton's *The Way: Walking in the Footsteps of Jesus.* The first lesson is on Baptism and Temptation.

THE DAWSEY CLASS: They are studying the text, *Grounded: Finding God in the world, a Spiritual Revolution*, by Diana Butler Bass. They will continue this study until the end of March.

THE GRACE CLASS: For a Lenten Study, they'll be going through the text, *Hanging By a Thread: The Questions of the Cross*. Reverend Diana Westerkam will continue to lead the first few weeks.

THE JOHN HARPER CLASS: Using Bible passages, their focus during March is on following God's guidance. Join them for a spirited discussion.

THE JOY CLASS: They are in the midst of studying the text, *Moses: In the Footsteps of the Reluctant Prophet*, by Adam Hamilton. THE OPEN DOOR CLASS: They will study, *Embracing the Uncertain*, by Magrey deVega during Lent. This book engages the readers to face life's uncertainties, not ignore them. The first six chapters focus on six post-Transfiguration, pre-Passion stories in the Gospels, pointing us forward to a cross that can show us how to follow Jesus with courage, hope, and obedience.
