Forward in Faith, Hope, and Love *A Letter from the Minister*

Last year as we kicked off our Stewardship Campaign, I outlined the focus of my pastoral vision for 2019: *Forward in Faith, Hope, and Love*. As we draw closer to the General Conference in February (23rd-26th), I want to share how I plan for us to walk through the days ahead. First, although we may be experiencing some institutional anxiety, I want us to go forward without fear. Fear undermines our faith in God's power to lead us and sustain us. There will likely be change, if not in February 2019, then at the 2020 General Conference. My goal is for the disciples of Jesus Christ who gather here at Washington Street to remain united in faith, hope, and love regardless of any changes to The Discipline. We have no idea what decision(s) will be made. It may be one of three plans presented by The Commission on a Way Forward, an amended plan based on petitions to the General Conference and/or action from the floor of The General Conference, or no change to The Discipline. My goal as your pastoral leader and as an Elder in the United Methodist Church will always be to strengthen your walk with Christ, and to lead this congregation in discipleship and service.

Now, I invite you to walk with me in prayer for our denomination and for our congregation. Bishop Holston has issued a call to "Forty Days of Prayer" that was released late last week, but we can still participate. The daily prayers are listed on page two in this issue of *The Connection*. Please join me in prayer daily at 2:23 PM, or at a time of your choosing, using the prayers provided.

You are then invited to share in a Prayer Vigil with other members here at Washington Street. We will have specific times for you to sign up to pray and the dates and times that the Chapel will be open, however, you do not have to come to The Chapel to participate in the Prayer Vigil. We want to be praying for the "work" of our General Conference at all times while the Conference is in session.

In addition, your clergy staff would like to recommend an unbiased presentation of our denomination's struggle with human sexuality in the book, *Living Faithfully: Human Sexuality and the United Methodist Church*. The goal of the book is to provide unbiased information so that people who don't know anything about this issue can learn. It also allows those on each side of this issue to see how—biblically and theologically—the other side came to its position. It's important to remember that we all, regardless of how we feel about this issue, are "people who are earnestly striving to live faithfully as United Methodists and as disciples of Jesus Christ." The books are easily accessible as a download to Kindle or from Amazon. We will order hard copies of the book for those who would like to purchase it through the church office or use one from our Library. In addition, Reverend Lippert will lead a small group discussion on this book at 5:30 PM on Wednesday nights (January 30th, February 6th, 20th, and 27th). Please join Reverend Lippert for honest, grace-filled conversation.

We have already offered three information sessions on the three plans that are being presented to The General Conference. Another presentation will be offered at 6:00 PM on Wednesday, February 18th in the Chapel.

On the Sunday following the General Conference, March 3rd, we will gather in the Name of Christ to worship God. Regardless of the decisions reached, we want to pray for all and any members of our congregation and United Methodist Connection who may be hurting. We cannot plan for what we do not know; but we can plan for what we do know: God is faithful, God is with us and we want to go forward in faith, hope, and love together.

In the weeks following, there will be opportunities for us to digest the decision and gather in small groups to hold conversation about how the decision(s) impact us as Washington Street. Those dates will be added to the calendar in the near future. I commend to your reading Isaiah 43:1-7 and the declaration of our God: "Do not fear, for I am with you."

40 Days of Shared Prayers For

A Future With Hope

Bishop L. Jonathan Holston invites South Carolina United Methodists to join him in 40 days of shared prayer each day from Monday, Jan. 14, through Friday, Feb. 22, leading up to the 2019 Special Session of the General Conference, scheduled for Feb. 23-26 in St. Louis, Missouri. Together each day, let us join one another in prayer, believing that God hears every word.

Each Sunday, we pray:

“Gracious and loving God, we give thanks for your presence in our lives and the promise that you have plans for us to prosper and not be harmed. Continue your good work in our families and our lives. Help us to understand how we can make a difference – in our church, in our community, and in our world – as your instrument of hope. Amen.”

Each Monday, we pray:

“Merciful God, help us to see the many opportunities before us to serve you by serving our neighbors. Open our hearts and our hands to both receive your grace and to offer it to everyone we meet. Amen.”

Each Tuesday, we pray:

“Almighty God, we confess to you that we have not loved you with our whole hearts. We have often failed to be an obedient church when we have not heard the cry of the needy. Free us for joyful obedience that, where there are corridors of shame, despair and want, we might create corridors of faith, hope and love that glorify you. Amen.”

Each Wednesday, we pray:

“Gracious God, I know that you are the potter and I am the clay. Mold me and make me into a disciple of Jesus Christ. Show me how to offer your grace and mercy in ways that transform the world. Amen.”

Each Thursday, we pray:

“Lord, we know that when we make space in our hearts for you, Jesus redeems the broken pieces of our lives. We ask, O God, that you will be at work in us and through us to make a difference in the lives of the hurting and the hungry in our midst. Amen.”

Each Friday, we pray:

“God, we thank you for the gift of faith that carries us through those times when we cannot yet see what you are doing in our midst. Help us to walk in your light and to be a light for others. Amen.”

Each Saturday, we pray:

“God of Heaven and Earth, as your humble servants, we know that the needs around the world and around the corner are great. Open our eyes so that we can see how to use the gifts you have given us to serve our neighbors and be in mission in the community and beyond. And give us the strength and perseverance to get started in this holy work. Amen.”

“Friends, prayer is powerful,” Bishop Holston says. “When our hearts and minds are engaged in a prayerful focus, we begin to see situations from the perspective of hope. There is not magic that erases our trials or suffering, but in the midst of it all, a life of prayer shifts our perspective from a spirit of despair toward a spirit of hope. We truly trust in God’s promises. My prayer for you is that this season of focused prayer will instill in your hearts a spirit of hope.” (umesc.org)



HEIFER INTERNATIONAL LIVING GIFT MARKET: Thank you to everyone who chose to give the gift of a life-sustaining gift through Heifer International. A total of \$2,065.00 was donated to Heifer International this Christmas. All donations will be divided between the following projects in Ecuador:

PACHA - CAMELID PROGRAM: This program includes families in Ecuador, Peru, and Bolivia. The program will run 2014-2024 and will involve 96,000 families. Local municipalities and ministries of agriculture are co-funding this project. For an indigenous farmer or artisan in the Andean region, alpaca, llama, and vicuna production is vital to survival, but due to climate change, agriculture has new challenges. The PACHA program brings new sustainable farming models plus the critical component of reliable market access so that farmers and artisans have a market to sell their meats and other goods, moving these families from simply surviving to thriving.

GANASOL AGRICULTURE & LIVESTOCK PROGRAM: The GANASOL program supports small-scale farming, indigenous and afro-descendant populations in order to increase the competitiveness of their agricultural production, ensure their food security and increase their interaction with local and broader markets. All of this is done under conditions that make it possible to generate reasonable profits for all involved in value chains, such as basic grains, poultry and guinea pigs, goat, swine, quinoa, amaranth, beans, native potatoes, fruits and agroecological produce. This program is located in Guatemala, Honduras, Nicaragua, Ecuador, Peru, Bolivia, and Mexico. The number of families to be helped is 696,000. The duration of the program is 2014-2024. Funding partners for the Ganasol program are the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, GEF, and Solidaridad Network.

Getting to Know

Addy Lee

If there's one word that describes Addy Lee, it's "busy." Busy at church. Busy at school. Busy with family.

"I'm always busy," the 15-year-old sophomore at Dreher High School said.

At Washington Street, Addy is a Girl Scout, with four other girls, in Troop 776, led by Heidi Conte. She's active in the Methodist Youth Fellowship, and she's a member of the New Worship Team.

During a trip to Ocean City, Maryland, in the summer of 2017, Addy attended a contemporary service at a church by the beach.

"It was pretty cool," she said. Addy brought the idea back to the New Worship Team, and associate minister Alston Lippert planned a contemporary service for F³ – Faith, Food and Fellowship – the Wednesday night suppers.

A contemporary Christian band from USC played a couple of songs at the beginning of the service. Alston put a message to the music, and the band concluded the service with another song.

On Laity Sunday, this past October, Addy read Isaiah 41:10, a verse about not being afraid because God is with us, and she talked about her worry when her grandmother was in the hospital.

The speaking was "a little scary," she said, even though she hasn't had stage fright when she's acted in plays. She gave her presentation at the 9 o'clock service and then edited her notes because she felt she had talked too long.

"It was definitely better at 11 o'clock," she said, adding, "it was fun to contribute."

Addy also is a member of the Youth Council, a group that meets with associate minister Taylor Pafford to plan fun events, trips, service projects, Sunday school curricula and Christ and Culture, which consists of lunch and a lesson on something that is happening in the world and how it intersects with life as a disciple of Christ.

Christ and Culture is held on fifth Sundays. The last one, December 30, considered the United Methodist Church's plans for "the way forward" regarding LGBTQ issues. The plans will be taken up at a called General Conference February 23-26 in St. Louis.

At Dreher, Addy's dad Dr. Chris Lee is the band director and her mom Kathleen Lee the dance teacher. Her dad also plays percussion in church when we have special music.

Addy takes classes from both parents. In the band, she plays percussion, like her dad.

"It may seem a little bit weird to have my parents for teachers, but it has its benefits," she said, explaining that she and her friends eat in her parents' quiet classrooms rather than in the noisy cafeteria.

Addy recently was named to Richland One's Honor Band and is auditioning Friday, January 25th, to be one of two Dreher drum majors. She will audition before a panel which includes her dad.

Addy wants to be a part of Carolina Crown, a drum corps featuring percussion and brass instruments affiliated with Drum Corps International. It is located in Fort Mill. She watches DCI performances on YouTube and goes to competitions during the summer.

"I love watching it, so I want to be a part of it," she said.

Addy wants to go to Salkehatchie this summer, but Washington Street's week at Penn Center conflicts with a band camp she goes to in Muncie, Indiana. She plans to sign up for a different Salkehatchie camp.

The music camp at Ball State – Music for All Summer Symposium – is "a life-changing experience," Addy said. In 2017, it had 1,473 campers, representing 645 schools and 39 states.

Last year, Addy went with her dad and the drum major. She participated in the Leadership Weekend and the marching percussion track. If she's selected as drum major at Dreher, she will participate in the drum major track this summer.

Addy said the most influential people in her life are her family.

"My mom and dad really inspired me to push myself and continue to do what I love," she said. They've helped her grow in her faith and taught her leadership skills and how to talk to people. She's also inspired by the kindness of her sister Emmi, a seventh-grader at Hand Middle School, she said.

Addy said the most meaningful thing about Washington Street is that the church has taught her to accept all people and to give back to her community through helping others.

"The mission statement on the front of the bulletin is very meaningful to me," she said. "To know that's what we support shows me what I need to do and what God can do.

"The community here at Washington Street is so strong, and I love being a part of it. Being able to help others through God's grace inspires me to make the world a better place."
