Happy New Year! A Message from our Minister

Regardless of how we celebrated the incoming of a New Year, the New year has begun. Most of us spend a little time looking back; it's the thing to do. We have seen our congregation fully embrace Renewal 2020 as our FACE Teams, and Committees gave superb leadership in our new program structure. I sense a renewed excitement among our members as we engage in new ministries and missions and take new risks for extending the Gospel into our community.

We began the New Year in worship (December 31) with a message from our Associate Minister for Nurture and Disciple Development, Alston Lippert. She challenged us to be "intentionally faithful" in the New Year. In almost the first paragraph she captured my imagination with the description of some of us putting our relationship with God on "auto pilot". I thought of all the ways I have let that happen over the years. Can you think of ways you have let that happen? The practices that are habitual and easy to fulfill are accomplished, but is there a hunger to go deeper with God? Is there a desire to ponder anew the gift of God's abundant life?

As the Renewal 2020 Team met (before I arrived) they were intentional in discussing renewal not as simply growing in numbers, but in deepening our faith and our walk with God. I am in agreement with that Team that our relationship with God, our discipleship, is the foundation for our renewal as individuals and as a congregation. I do not want WSUMC to do more in order to be busy. Business does not make or nurture disciples. I want us to be intentional about deepening our relationship with God so that sharing the joy of knowing God through Jesus becomes a natural expression of who we are.

As we move into 2018, I encourage you to begin making some intentional commitments. We are launching new small groups this January. A study of the book by Howard Thurman, Jesus and the Disinherited, will begin on Tuesday, January 16th at noon. Reverend Lippert will lead that discussion. Beth Matthews will lead a discussion of Reuben Job's book, Three Simple Questions, on Thursday evenings at 5:30, beginning January 18th. Maybe this is an intentional step that you could take. Or maybe you need to re-engage with Sunday School. Or, you would like to serve on a ministry team. We can always add new members to ministry teams; is God calling you to deepen your commitment to serving as a leader in the congregation? Or maybe God is challenging you to be more regular in worship or to practice generosity in new ways: teaching or singing in the choir. We will be Previewing our service PAUSE: TO REFLECT, TO RENEW, TO CONNECT January 25th at 12:15 at the Tapp's Fountain Room. How about committing to helping launch this new service for our downtown community? As we enter into the season of Lent on February 14th, new small group studies will launch, and our Wednesday Lenten services and luncheons will begin. All of these are opportunities for you to deepen your relationship with God, INTENTIONALLY.

It's a new Year and a new opportunity to encounter and to be encountered by the God who is making all things new.

Getting to Know Jerry Sumpter

"Working at Washington Street has helped him grow spiritually," property/maintenance supervisor Jerry Sumpter said.

It was the church's "friendly Christian spirit" that made him fall in love with it, Jerry said. He especially enjoyed talking with members of the congregation, including Bill Brumbach, Dunbar Godbold, Jenny Curtis and Esther Lanier and others in the "old Soup Cellar crew."

Jerry has worked here more than 25 years. He was hired to work part time, stripping and waxing the first floor and cleaning the sanctuary. After working at Washington Street in the morning, he went to his full-time job, night-time supervisor at John P. Thomas Elementary School in Richland District One.

When Joe Garris, the church's building superintendent, resigned, Jerry asked Dr. John Stapleton, the senior minister, for the job, and he got it.

Today, he oversees the work of outside contractors, supervises custodians and helps staff and members with whatever they ask him to do.

"I walk around and make sure the property is well-kept," Jerry said, and when a contractor completes a job, he and business manager, Robbie Douglas, inspect the job to make sure it was done correctly.

Jerry grew up in Orangeburg and went to Orangeburg-Wilkinson High School. The year he was a senior he was the point guard on the basketball team that won the state championship.

He met his wife, Sonya Green-Sumpter, when she was working in the church's Child Development Center after she left public-school teaching. But it wasn't until after she left the CDC that they connected at Saint Luke's Baptist Church on Farrow Road and started dating.

They were married in 2001 in the Washington Street sanctuary. The Rev. Dr. Mike Alexander, Washington Street's senior minister, and the Rev. Gerald Tucker, from Saint Luke's Baptist, officiated, and people from both congregations attended.

Today Jerry and Sonya, who is a senior analyst in SCE&G's Transmission Department, have two children: 9-year-old Justus, whose main interest is soccer, and Sierra, a freshman at Ridge View High School, where she plays basketball and runs track. Sierra also plays violin in the school orchestra and in their church, First Northeast Baptist. Jerry also has an older son, Jeremy Sumpter, from a previous relationship. Jerry has four season tickets to the Gamecock Women's basketball games. They take the kids to the weekend games, and sometimes, he and his wife go during the week. He also has taken his son's soccer team to see the Gamecock Women's soccer team play. Jerry has coached youth recreational sports – soccer and basketball – for about 15 years. He also has coached basketball for his church's team.


"I fit it all in," he said. "I believe in being there for whatever my kids like to do." Asked if he has felt the spirit of any Washington Street saints who have gone on to the next world, Jerry said he isn't sure.

"If I hear a door closing or see something out of the corner of my eye, I tell myself that that's just Sophie checking on everybody to see if they're doing what they ought to be doing," he said. Sophie is the woman who is buried under the church. According to the story, her husband put a glass faceplate on the casket so he could continue to see her beauty.

To get to her grave, you must go down a little scuttle hole in the janitor's closet, located next to the 2s and 3s Sunday School room. Then, you crawl through a lighted passage that leads to the grave, which is located between Patricia's and Joe's offices.

In years past, youths in the church, who wanted to see Sophie, would make the trip. And every once in a while, Jerry gets a phone call from "someone who wants to go down and see her, and they do," Jerry said. But he never went down to see her himself. "I've been told the glass has a nice little crack in it, and you really can't see her like you used to," he said.

The following entry appeared in the January 10th bulletin: "A grave crisis confronts the smaller colleges due to the lowering of the draft age [during World War II] to include students 18 & 19 years of age. This will take approximately 75% of the Wofford Student Body... We will not let this grand old institution down during this emergency."
