As we continue through the Lenten Season in preparation for Easter, we hope you will plan to join us for the various worship opportunities listed below during the last week of March. The Stations of the Cross will be available for you to journey through at any point from Wednesday, March 28th - Friday, March 30th.

# Palm Sunday

## Sunday, March 25th | 11:00 AM ONLY | Sanctuary

On Palm Sunday (March 25th), we will open Holy Week together in a service of prayer and music at 11:00 AM in the Sanctuary. Beginning with an organ prelude celebrating Palm Sunday, the service includes the children's palm procession, congregational singing and prayer, and culminates in a dynamic musical reflection on Christ's last words from the cross.



Children will attend their regular Sunday School classes during the 9:45AM hour. At 10:55 AM, Sunday school teachers will walk the children down to the lobby area between the Chapel and the Wesley Room, where children will collect their Palm branches for the Palm processional. \**If your child is under the age of 4, we ask that a parent accompany them during the processional.* \*

During the opening hymn, we will process by walking down the far left aisle to the front of the sanctuary, and back down the right aisle returning to the narthex. From there, any child who normally attends Children's Church (ages 2-kindergarten) will be taken to the Children's Church classroom. All older children will be invited to return into the Sanctuary to sit with their families. There will not be a Children's moments during our Palm/Passion Sunday celebration, but worship packets will be available to children who remain in worship. Questions? Ask Rev. # Sunday School Classes

What are they studying?

Several of our adult Sunday School classes just started new studies, and others are wrapping up previous ones. Looking for a place to go this Sunday morning? New friends are always welcome!

THE ALDERSGATE CLASS: David Anderson will continue leading discussions on Adam Hamilton's *The Way: Walking in the Footsteps of Jesus.* The first lesson is on Baptism and Temptation.

THE DAWSEY CLASS: They are studying the text, Grounded: Finding God in the world, a Spiritual Revolution,

by Diana Butler Bass. They will continue this study until the end of March.

THE GRACE CLASS: For a Lenten Study, they'll be going through the text, *Hanging By a Thread: The Questions of the Cross.* THE JOHN HARPER CLASS: Using Bible passages, their focus during March is on following God's guidance. Join them for a spirited discussion.

THE JOY CLASS: They are in the midst of studying the text, *Moses: In the Footsteps of the Reluctant Prophet*, by Adam Hamilton. THE OPEN DOOR CLASS: They will study, *Embracing the Uncertain*, by Magrey deVega during Lent. This book engages the readers to face life's uncertainties, not ignore them. The first six chapters focus on six post-Transfiguration, pre-Passion stories in the Gospels, pointing us forward to a cross that can show us how to follow Jesus with courage, hope, and obedience.

## Getting to Know Sandy Endicott

Three years ago when Washington Street business administrator Robbie Douglas placed an ad for a "mess sergeant," on Craig's List, Sandy Endicott answered it and became manager of the church's Soup Cellar.

"I don't think they could prepare anybody for what goes on down there," Sandy said. "It's more than cooking." A number of the Soup Cellar guests have addiction issues, Sandy said. She tells guests not to bring their substances onto the premises, and she bans them for profanity and making disparaging remarks of a racial or sexual nature.

When asked the best and most difficult parts of her job, Sandy gives the same answer for both: the people.

"I never had much contact with homeless people" she said. "One man has a degree in music – when he starts playing the piano, people just stop talking and listen. But he has a terrible drinking problem."

Sandy said the population of the Soup Cellar "is not a static crowd; I get new people all the time."

She knows the regulars by name. One keeps her posted on what's happening on the street – who got in a fight, who got arrested and who died. Another one carries the day's large bag of trash around the church, to the dumpster.

The Soup Cellar opened on October 15, 1979, in the basement of the 1901 Building. Washington Street members and staff operated it during the first year, when it served lunch only on Monday and Friday.

Today, between 11:30 and 12:30, Monday through Friday, the Soup Cellar feeds roughly 190 people a day – more toward the end of the month after welfare checks and food stamps have run out. Seventeen churches contribute financially, and 14 churches volunteer to prepare and serve food.

Sandy grew up in Columbia. Her first career, in telecommunications, lasted more than 25 years. Along the way, Sandy married twice. The first marriage ended in divorce after five years and the birth of two sons, Ryan and Michael. She was married to her second husband for 14 years until he died in 2003.

In 2013, Sandy began studying at the Culinary Institute of Charleston. She learned from "awesome" chefs from the city's restaurants. While in school and after graduation, she worked at Caviar and Bananas Market & Café, Toast, and Charleston Grill, all in Charleston.

Sandy said her grandmother "Nanny" was her inspiration. They would watch "The Galloping Gourmet" together, and Sandy would watch Nanny experiment in the kitchen.

Sandy returned to Columbia in 2015, after her mother died, and her father, now 86, called her to ask, "How do you fry chicken?" "How do you turn the oven on?" "How do you turn the oven off?" She moved in with him in a neighborhood near the VA Hospital.

Only three of the churches which volunteer make soup. When Sandy makes soup, she uses whatever she has on hand and whatever inspires her. Soup season runs from mid-October until mid-April. In the summer, Sandy makes a pasta salad. Volunteers make sandwiches, and the meal includes a drink and dessert. But, Sandy doesn't eat while working. "I can't eat until supper-time," she said.

Part of her job is working with agencies that can help her guests. When a person who is mentally ill wants help, Sandy calls MIRCI – Mentally Ill Recovery Center, Inc. – on Rosewood Drive, and MIRCI sends a caseworker to pick him up.

When guests, who have been to the Palmetto Baptist emergency room, come to the Soup Cellar in hospital gowns and pants because their clothes were cut off of them, she sends them to Clean of Heart, a nearby Catholic charity, which has an emergency clothes closet for the homeless.

Sandy jokes that the best thing about her job is having weekends off, something that never happened in the restaurant business. She spends that time with her grandsons, a 10-year-old in Chester or a 5-year-old and an infant in Summerville. Sometimes they come to see her.

Sandy has earned a brown belt in mixed martial arts and a blue belt in karate, but she hasn't had time for those sports in a couple of years. She has a full plate as she fills the plates in the Soup Cellar.
