

Dear Washington Street UMC:

WOW! What a busy and exciting year we've had at Washington Street. We are now served by three outstanding clergy, Rev. Parrish, Rev. Wilson and Rev. Lippert, and Renewal 2020 has resulted in the creation of our new "FACE" structure: Faith Formation, Age Level Ministries, Connections, and Engaging New People. So many exciting things are happening: Brown Bag Bible Study, Active Faith small group work, numerous prayer and study groups, exercise classes, and our first Body and Soul Health Fair was just held. So many Washington Streeters have "engaged" in these programs and many are working tirelessly to further God's kingdom here on our earth as we seek to make disciples to share God's word in our community and beyond.

It's also the time when we begin to focus on Stewardship. At this time we begin to ask ourselves how we can serve God in ways that glorify our Lord and support the work of our beloved church. 
