s a visible witness to God's inclusive love for all people, members of WSUMC participated in Famously Hot SC LGBTQ Pride on October 22 and 23. On Friday evening, approximately 25 members of WSUMC, their friends and relatives, marched in

the PRIDE parade. This marked the fourth time WSUMC has had a presence in the parade.

On Saturday, for the first time, WSUMC had a vendor booth at the festival where luggage tags, key chains, fans, stickers, etc., all purchased and donated by members of the Grace Sunday School Class and all with affirming messages and information about WSUMC, were given to festival goers.
