WSUMC'S New "Little Free Hygiene Pantry"

My name is Lydia Conte. I am a member of Washington Street United Methodist Church and of Girl Scout Troop 776. I am a new graduate of Dreher High School, and a rising freshman at Furman University.

On June 12, 2022, Pastor Shirley allowed time for me to share information about a project that I and a team of partners have been working on for over a year. On this day, we dedicated the Little Free Hygiene Pantry to the Soup Cellar at Washington Street UMC.

As I was beginning to brainstorm ideas for my Girl Scout Gold Award project, I looked back on the many service projects that I had enjoyed doing in the past. Some of my favorite experiences and cherished memories have been helping in the soup cellar at Washington Street. When I was a young girl, I always loved being in the Mary's Maiden Circle. Filling up bags full of hygiene products for clients of the soup cellar around the holidays was always one of my favorite activities and I knew I wanted to do something to honor the impact that had on me under the leadership of Mary Lide and Kathy Wright. They taught me how to experience the joy of caring for others.

The pandemic has made us all more aware of the importance of keeping our bodies clean and free of dangerous germs. My idea was very simple. I wanted to provide hygiene products year-round for those in need. The soup cellar was a perfect outlet to reach this community. So, the idea of the Little Free Hygiene Pantry was born. Although its similarly

named, it's not like the Little Free Library my troop installed at Suber Marshall United Methodist in 2014, where neighbors and school children in the



surrounding area are encouraged to take a book or leave a book. Instead, it is a cabinet that I thrifted and refurbished that will be placed in the soup cellar to be stocked with ten different kinds of travel size hygiene products that people can just take on the way out of the soup cellar whenever the soup cellar team decides the time is right to open it up.

Personal hygiene is so important to not only physical health but mental health. When personal hygiene declines, it can easily lead to self-esteem issues,

which are just as dangerous and damaging for adults as they are for teenagers. Through the personal hygiene pantry, I hope to solve this problem for those in need in our community.

I'd like to thank all of the partners who have supported me in this project and pledged to keep the Little Free Hygiene Pantry stocked and open for business on an on-going basis.

Robbie Douglas is my project advisor and has been kind and generous with his patience and wisdom.

The WSUMC Soup Cellar Team supported my idea from



the start. Thank you to Terrence Chisholm, Jerry Sumpter, Lee Smith, Alan Jon Zupan, and Tommy Bedenbaugh for meeting with me and providing encouragement in those early days.

The Missions Committee has pledged to keep The Little Free Hygiene Pantry on the church's radar throughout the year, every year.

Mackin Wall and the Youth Group of Washington Street have also committed to continuously monitor the inventory and hold drives to keep supplies in stock.

Sam Waldrep and the Active Faith Ministry team always answer the call for help and are considering ways to support this mission.

And, of course, the

WSUMC Mary's Maidens Circle never misses an opportunity to model behavior for everyone in how to follow the Way of Christ and will be coming up with crafty ideas to support the Little Free Hygiene Pantry.

Jane Peterson will be sharing more information in emails and *The Connection* about how all of us can keep the pantry stocked with the easy AmazonSmile Wish List (scan the QR code below) purchasing process, where items can be shipped directly to the church, and we receive a portion of the purchase price as well as the item.

Finally, I'd like to thank Anne Sinclair, a Girl Scout Woman of Distinction, for always encouraging me on my Girl Scout journey. It's been over a decade since I started as a Daisy scout. Anne has been a steadfast cheer leader and advisor throughout.

And to everyone who bought all of those cookies, thank you. The funds raised helped bring this project to life.

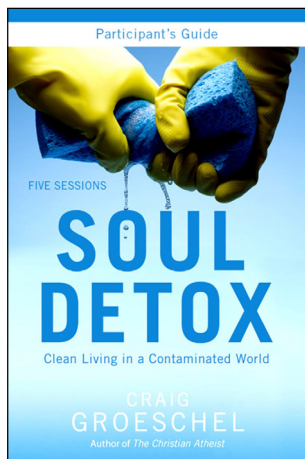

Several new online and in person discussions are now available for all WSUMC members, and friends.

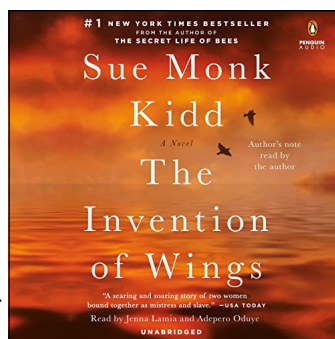

We are all devastated by the continual violent acts, not only in the United States but around the globe, that are taking the lives of innocent individuals – often children and vulnerable adults who are unable to defend themselves.
