Congregational Study

J oin us as we read through Paul's letter to the church in Philippi. This will be a slow read for us as we join together in a sermon series entitled "Courage" based on passages from Philippians. The study begins on August 18th, and continues through until Sept. 16.



CONGREGATIONAL

Some days there will be more for you to read, while other days will only have two or three verses. This is intentional. Here's some advice:

• Sit and savor it. Don't rush. Don't just check the box for the day. On the days when there are only a few verses, read them multiple times. Paul's letter is very short, but it is packed with a lot of dense ideas.

• Read with a pen. Don't be afraid to underline words or passages. Take notes.

• Ask questions. If something confuses you or bugs you, don't just close the book; Ask a question! Write your question in the margin, ask a pastor, a friend, or Google.

• We read it in context. Remember, this is a letter! It would have been read in one sitting, probably out loud—not in bite-sized chunks.

• Read for 5 days then at the end of the week take the daily digest, and read it all together in one sitting, ideally out loud with other people. It'll shift your perspective! Remember, you aren't reading alone.

• *The Reconciling Next Team:* discussed suggestions on how to become more open and involved with individuals. These suggestions were made because of the Intergenerational Dialogue session on LBGTQIA+ issues and the church.

* To provide a more visible, intentional space for LGBTQIA+ individuals that is explicitly queer-friendly where multi-generational conversations could be held. This will be starting on August 28, and will take place in the Holroyd Prayer Room during the Sunday School hour.

* The possibility of planning a weekday gathering that is spiritual, but not religious.

* Provide a support network (or events) for parents of LGBTQIA+ children.

* To be visible advocates at Statehouse events continuing to share our stance on issues of justice and equality in numerous ways (letters, articles on church events, etc.).

* Use the recent Racial Justice Action Team letter writing campaign format as a guide for future such actions, and provide organized "push back" on hurtful and hateful stances in government and in the community.

* Possible plans to host a coffee once a month to get to know people in a more personal way in Threatt Hall, or an off-site location at some other time of the day/week.

* Having a service of LGBTQIA+ Repentance and Healing planned for Thursday, Oct. 13.

* Continue with our recognition of the Transgender Day of Remembrance (Nov. 20). As a visible witness, the church banner and ribbons will be displayed on the Bull Street fence during the month of November. Jim will lead this effort and noted the number of documented transgender individuals who were murdered rose from 44 to 58 last year.

• *Active Faith* is accepting items for the Yard Sale scheduled for Oct. 8 in Threatt Hall. Large items such as furniture (no holes or rips, please) may be brought to the church after Labor Day.
