United Women in Faith Bake Sale is November 20!

In March 2022, United Methodist Women became United Women in Faith. This name change includes an array of new and improved programs for both future current members. We welcome new women to join us and put their love in action for women, children, and youth. The new programs are the results of research conducted over the past five years with input from more than 24,000 United Methodists and women of other Christian traditions. The changes are designed to address the different needs and life stages of current members and new women and to expand options for membership and engagement. The organization remains incorporated in New York as United Methodist Women and is doing business as United Women in Faith.

At Washington Street, United Methodist Women's circles have begun meeting and planning projects for the year.

A focus of helping women this year will be the MicroLoan program for women through the Methodist Church in Pijal, Ecuador. During the pandemic, \$50.00 grants were provided by the UMW at the national level to women entrepreneurs in various countries including Ecuador. Five women received the grants in Pijal and decided to consider the money loans, not grants, so the money could be repaid and support more women. Now the Methodist church in Pijal hosts a group of ten entrepreneurial women who gather monthly for a devotion and to talk about improving their business.

We will be having our Thanksgiving Bake Sale on Sunday, November 20, from 9:30-12:30 in the Wesley Room. A portion of the proceeds from this sale will be given to the Methodist Church in Pijal to continue the MicroLoan program.
