### Getting to Know Jammie Watters

ammie Watters, our new administrative assistant, had many, and varied jobs on her way to Washington Street. She worked as a part-time bookkeeper, even before she earned an associate's degree in accounting at Midlands Technical College in 2008. She worked for Waffle House for 10 years, starting as a waitress and working her way up to assistant store manager.

And, she also worked for the MTC Airport Campus bookstore until it closed in 2014.

Jammie was named after her father, James, and her name is pronounced with a long a. Her father thought that spelling it with two m's made it more feminine.

Jammie moved to Columbia from Ohio when she was 16. An older sister's husband was a victim when another man "took an ax to his head," damaging his hearing and his vision. Her parents decided to move here to support her sister and her brother-in-law.

Jammie attended Lexington High School, where she graduated in 1991. In 1992, she married and took the last name Watters. The couple separated in 2000 and finalized their divorce in 2006.

Although she remarried, she kept the last name Watters. Officials in the divorce court said she should keep it in order to have the same last name as her children. And, she also wanted to avoid the hassle that came with a name change. For example, it took the Social Security Administration a year to get Watters spelled correctly on her social security card.

Jammie worked for Waffle House from 1995 to 2005. She was a waitress, a cook, a district relief manager and an assistant manager in the Irmo store. Initially, she worked at the Waffle House at 2510 Sunset Blvd., near Lexington Medical Center's main campus.

When she was district relief manager, she filled in at a couple of restaurants when the district manager had the day off.

In 2007, Jammie went to work in the Midlands Technical College bookstore. She was a cashier, and later head cashier, she did customer service, she ordered snacks and drinks, she helped the buyer do inventory. The manager referred a consumer's complaint to her with the comment, "She knows what she's doing."

"I had a lot of knowledge and got to do a lot of different things," Jammie said. MTC closed the bookstore in 2014, outsourcing the work to Barnes & Noble.

In February 2016, Jammie became the administrative assistant at College Place United Methodist Church, which is adjacent to Columbia College. She was there until the day it closed its doors, last June. Washington Street is bigger and has a lot more activity than College Place had, Jammie said. The college used College Place for Wednesday chapel, graduation and convocations, but these gradually diminished over time, she said.

She said the church had seven or eight full members when it closed, plus a few homebound members and about 15 people who came sometimes. Two of



the members, Ellen Parker and Joe Plaugh, transferred to Washington Street, but most transferred to Virginia Wingard Memorial UMC, Jammie said.

Jammie met her second husband, Johnny McPherson Jr., when she was assistant manager of the Irmo Waffle House. He is an electrician who owns a company with his dad. Jammie and Johnny were friends for two years before they started dating, she said. They married in 2007.

Jammie has four daughters, aged 27, almost 20, 18 and 14.

She said she likes to read "anything except romance novels." Recent favorites include books in the "Odd Thomas" series by Dean Koontz, a #1 New York Times suspense author. Odd Thomas is a short order cook in Pico Mundo, California, who communicates with the dead and races to defeat evil.

Jammie also likes to bake yeast rolls and cakes from scratch. One recent evening, she was making a Mexican dish consisting of shredded chicken, cheese sauce, beans and rice. She didn't have a recipe for cheese sauce, so she made one up.

This time of year, she enjoys watching "Charlie Brown's Christmas" and "Frosty the Snowman" with her granddaughters Violet, 2, and Cordelia, 4 months.

On Saturday mornings Johnny and Jammie volunteer with a youth bowling league in Irmo. She is the treasurer, and he is the coach.

"I tell the kids, 'I will be your cheerleading squad,'" Jammie said, adding that their 14-year-old hopes that high bowling scores will bring her scholarships.
