PRAYER OF CONFESSION

One: Let us pray: Dear God of Christmas Peace, we give you thanks that your love never ends.

All: We are thirsty for your grace. You made a way for us in the wilderness, and still, in our foolishness, we go astray. We hide our eyes from your presence. We do not listen to your word. We are lifeless when we ought to dance and speechless when we ought to sing. Forgive us, O Lord.
