

Holy Week at Washington Street

This Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, the most sacred week in the Christianity. It begins with Palm Sunday, which commemorates Jesus's entrance into the city of Jerusalem, and concludes with his resurrection on Easter Sunday.

As a prelude to WSUMC's Holy Week events, children (nursery through 5th grade) are invited to participate in the annual *Easter Egg Hunt on Saturday, April 1, at 4:00 pm.* Children from one of our sister churches, Wesley UMC, are joining us for this year's Easter Egg Hunt which will be held at the Lide's home. As Jesus entered the city of Jerusalem just before his death on the Cross, people cut palm branches, waved them in the air, and laid them on the ground before Jesus as He rode into the city on a donkey. The palm branches represented goodness and were symbolic of the final victory He would soon fulfill over death. Remembering this triumphal entry, all 3-year-olds through 5th graders are invited to participate in a palm waving processional during our **11:00 am worship service on Palm Sunday, April 2nd.** *If your child would like to participate, email Sarah-Kate (sarahkate@wsmethodist.org) and plan to meet Sarah-Kate and Sam Waldrep outside the Wesley Room 10 minutes before the service begins to line up and receive palm branches to wave during the procession.*

On **Maundy Thursday, April 6, at 7:30 pm** in **Christ Chapel**, we will remember Jesus's Journey to the Cross and share in a special communion service remembering the Last Supper. The word "maundy" is derived from the Latin word for command and is a reference to Jesus' commandment to the disciples to "love one another as I have loved you." If you are not able to attend this service in person, but would like to have us bring communion to your home, please contact Rev. Becky (rjshirley@umcsc.org).

We will gather together again in **Christ Chapel on Good Friday, at 7:30 pm** for a Tenebrae service with witnesses of the Passion of Christ. The service of Tenebrae, meaning "darkness" or "shadows," has been practiced by the church since medieval times. Once a service for the monastic community, Tenebrae later became an important part of the worship of the common folk during Holy Week. We join Christians of many generations throughout the world in using the liturgy of Tenebrae which includes the gradual extinguishing of candles



and a "strepituous" or "loud noise" taking place in total darkness near the end of the service as we remember Christ's passion.

We will spend Holy Saturday contemplating what Jesus's life, death and resurrection mean for our personal lives and for the world. On **Easter Sunday** morning we will begin our celebration of Jesus's triumph over death and His Resurrection as we gather for a congregation-wide **Easter Breakfast at 10:00 am in Threatt Hall.** Breakfast will be provided by some of our adult Sunday school classes, so if you are involved in an adult Sunday School class, please contact your class leader for details. Our 11:00 am service of worship will feature special music helping us feel the joy of the good news of Christ's Resurrection, and, as usual, persons who are not able to attend this service in person may participate via livestream on YouTube (youtube.com/c/WashingtonStreetUMC). This year's Easter Sunday activities will also include a photo booth available from 9:30 am to 1:00 pm, and again for 30 minutes after the service of worship. We are grateful to WSUMC young adult, McKenzie Powers, who is a freshman at USC, but also a professional photographer, for providing this opportunity to all our Easter Sunday worshippers. We hope you will make plans to join us for all of these special services and that you will invite your family and friends and join us as well.

RJAT to host Civil Rights Walking Tour Downtown

On Sunday, April 30th, from 4:30-5:30 pm, the Racial Justice Action Team (RJAT) is partnering with Columbia 63: Our Story Matters to host a guided Civil Rights walking tour of Main St.

The tour takes visitors on a journey of some of Columbia's Civil Rights noteworthy and moving stories. Currently, eight markers, and various other installations, serve as reminders of pivotal incidents that occurred along Main St.

The walking tour will begin at the African American monument on the Sumter Street side of the statehouse grounds. The tour will leave from there, and everyone will walk down Main Street where the tour will end at City Hall on the corner of Main and Laurel streets. This walk is approximately seven blocks and the tour will last approximately one hour. The starting point is also symbolized by a green marker on the interactive tour map featured on the Columbia SC 63 website.

After the tour, we will gather in Boyd Plaza in front of the Museum on Main St. for refreshments and conversation.

We encourage you to join us on this tour to hear the stories and feel the history along Main St. All are welcome regardless
