Reconciling Next is hosting "Finding Courage to Speak and Act: LGBTQIA+ Activists & Allies' Journey in the UMC." The special dinner and program will be held Wednesday, May 24, from 6:00 to 8:00 pm in Threatt Hall. Our guest speakers are authors Nancy Malcom and AJ Ramirez. Both have published several articles on the topic.

Dr. Nancy Malcom (she/her) is a sociologist at Georgia Southern University whose research and teaching focus on gender, childhood, and sports. Recent publications include "From William's Doll to Jacob's New Dress: The Depiction of Gender Non-Conforming Boys in Children's Books from 1972 to 2014" (Journal of Homosexuality, 2018) and "Negotiating the Funhouse: CrossFit Women and the Looking Glass



Athlete" (Women in Sport and Physical Activity Journal, 2021). Dr. Malcom is an active member of Pittman Park UMC in Statesboro, GA, and attended the 2019 UMC Next conference as part of the delegation from South Georgia.

Dr. AJ Ramirez (she/her) is the coordinator of Women's & Gender Studies and a Sociology faculty member at Valdosta State University. Her academic interests include sexism, LGBTQ issues, and education reform. When not teaching, she also practices as a licensed Professional Counselor in Valdosta, Georgia. Dr. Ramirez is a member and Lay Servant of Centenary UMC in Macon, GA and leads an outreach Reconciling United Methodist Community in Valdosta, GA for displaced United Methodists and others who need an affirming place to worship God.

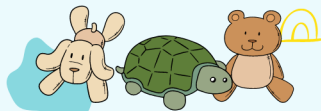

WSUMC Committee & Team Reports

Church Council

Highlights from Church Council included the approval of an updated Safe Sanctuary Policy. Sarah-Kate Gravely and Rev. Alston Lippert revised this policy to better reflect WSUMC's values, building restrictions and safety procedures. Council reviewed and approved the updated policy. You can read a copy of it on our website at wsmethodist.org/facility/forms-and-policies/.

The WSUMC Bull Street Sign Committee has been reconstituted with representation from key church committees. The hope is that this new sub-committee, consisting of representation from key constituents and areas of interest with decision-making powers, can compile and formulate a comprehensive recommendation that can be brought to the Church Council for consideration.

This five-person sub-committee of the Church Council includes the following:

Ray Cobb - rep from Trustees (Chair)

Joe Epting - rep from Finance

Jane Peterson - rep from Communications/Tech

Ed McClain - rep from History & Archives

Kimberly McAllister - rep from the congregation as Lay Leader

Christine Hait will serve as an alternate.

The committee is charged with taking the information and findings already gathered, completing any further required research, and bringing back to the Church Council an actionable recommendation for consideration and vote. The actionable recommendation should be comprehensive (design, location, cost, tech, approvals, other related considerations, etc.) and in a state ready for execution if approved. The Trustees will be responsible for the execution of any such Council-approved recommendation.

There is no defined timeline or target date for a recommendation. Council will take direction on this from the committee. However, until a recommendation is brought to the Church Council, the committee will be prepared to provide a brief written report to the Church Council at each of their regularly scheduled meetings.

Worship Team

The Worship Team reported a successful Lenten season of worship at WSUMC. The worship opportunities were well-planned, executed, and attended thanks to the hard work from our ministers, staff, and other Worship Team volunteers. Highlights are as follows:

Mid-week Wednesday Lenten Services were held starting with Ash Wednesday, February 22 through March 29. Attendance averaged around 35 for these services. A well-rounded program of music, drama, and messages was offered. Mary Lide and her team of volunteers provided excellent noonday meals of homemade soup, sandwiches, and desserts. Proceeds benefited the Soup Cellar.

Palm Sunday, April 2, featured a processional by our choir

and children. The sanctuary was adorned with eight palms and a "Via Dolorosa" display in the narthex. Holy Communion was also observed on this special Sunday.

Maundy Thursday, April 6, was observed in Christ Chapel with Holy Communion, stripping of the altar, and special music from our choir.

Good Friday, April 7, was certainly one of the highlights during Lent. A traditional Tenebrae service featuring our ministers and five members—Thom Berry, Susan Caskey, Lee Haynes, Jim Tuell, and Ute Wachsmann-Linnan—was a deeply moving, somber, and spiritual experience.

Easter Sunday, April 9, was inspiring in so many ways—from Rev. Shirley's message, to the beautiful music, to the amazing 70+ hydrangeas adorning our sanctuary, not to mention the 300+ persons in attendance (and 300+ online)! The Easter brunch in Threath Hall was a huge success, along with the photo booth thanks to the efforts of McKenzie Powers and Sarah-Kate Gravely, our Director of Children & Youth Ministries.

A new sermon series started on April 16 and will continue through May 21. It focuses on the different ways we know Jesus. It is loosely based on a book by Diana Butler Bass, *Freeing Jesus: Rediscovering Jesus as Friend, Teacher, Savior, Lord, Way, and Presence*. Coming up, we will have several special services—Mother's Day (May 14), and Ascension Sunday with Confirmation for our five confirmands on May 21. Then on May 28 we will celebrate our graduates. On June 4 we will send off our Salkehatchi team who depart on Saturday, June 10.

The team is also seeking a professional consultation about our sound system and equipment. There is no clear date for the installation of the projection system in the sanctuary; however, we anticipate that it will be soon.

Communications/Technology Team

At the request of the chair of Trustees (Pete Liggett), an inventory of technology currently in the church and available for general use (i.e., not tied to a particular pastor or staff member's needs) was prepared. This report included televisions, cameras, DVR/BluRay players, computers, and projectors. Based on this inventory, a request for additional and updated technology for use in worship settings, classrooms, and meeting spaces was submitted.

The UMC motto "Open Minds, Open Hearts, Open Doors" was placed on the vacant side of the parking lot sign until a determination as to the future of this sign is made.

The team continues to encourage the congregation to use Realm and sign up for available training.

Director of Engagement Report

Christine Taylor reported some very encouraging participation numbers for our FUEL events. There have been an average of 75 participants and 7-10 volunteers at our monthly FUEL events.

She also reported an average of 15 participants in the new Sunday School class named Solomon's Porch. Fourteen people registered for the in-person Lenten Book Study and 15 registered for the online group. Over 120 attended Easter Sunday breakfast!

A new small group led by Christine Hait follows the new sermon series, "The Jesus I Have Known" (April 19-May 24). The small group is being held as a hybrid on Wednesdays at 7:00 pm in the John Harper Classroom and via Zoom. This summer, the YMCA is partnering with WSUMC for kids' camps (June 5- July 28). And plans are in the works for a summer VBS for adults (July 10-14). WSUMC's card ministry, greeter program, and monthly FUEL events will continue!

Child Development Center (CDC) Report

The Washington Street Child Development Center (CDC) has been getting back to normal since COVID-19. We have 49 students enrolled at this time and will have 50 students by May 1, 2023. Even though this is below our enrollment before COVID-19, it has grown from the 35 students enrolled for the last two years. We have 12 full-time staff, one part-time staff, and we will have a seasonal teacher this summer. Many of the programs that we were unable to provide due to COVID-19 have been reinstated this year.

Due to many grants, we have been able to supplement the loss of tuition/income and help offset our expenses. Our revenue and expenses look very good for January-April as they show a surplus. This surplus will help us finish out the year when the grant money is depleted. We are hoping to have a good surplus at the end of the year to put in the CDC Reserve for a rainy day.

Church & Society

Welcome Table Team

The Welcome Table team is continuing to support persons experiencing food insecurity in our community by providing wellness/care services and warm food through multiple avenues. The team supported monthly breakfasts on select Saturdays. These were hosted and staffed by USC's MSN Network, averaging about 75 guests each time. The last Welcome Table/Soup Cellar joint meal was held on Easter Monday, April 10th with 150 guests served at this event. A Richland County Discretionary Fund grant is managed and distributed to support the team's service to this vulnerable community. Depending on a quarterly audit in April of remaining funds, the Welcome Table Team hopes to sponsor a breakfast event in June.

Racial Justice Action Team

On March 21, Dr Willie James Jennings spoke at Lutheran Theological Southern seminary. The title of his lecture was "Overcoming Racial Faith, What Acts Teaches Us About God." As a prelude to the lecture, several members of WSUMC met with Dr. Melanie Dobson for a small group discussion of Dr. Jennings' writings.

In our ongoing efforts to combat gun violence, members of the RJAT were provided with a great resource from United Methodist Communications - "Ways United Methodist Can

This Sunday, April 30, the team is partnering with the USC Center of Civil Rights History and Research to provide a guided tour of Main Street as part of the SC63: Our Story Matters initiative, uncovering and celebrating pieces of Columbia's Civil Rights story. The tour starts at the African American monument at the SC State House. Following the tour, the group will meet at Boyd Plaza for refreshments and a discussion. This tour is a follow-up to the November 2022 event at WSUMC which focused on numerous unsung heroes of the Civil Rights movement in Columbia.

Reconciling Next Team

The team reviewed and provided input on the recently released Washington Street statement on remaining part of the United Methodist Church. The input from the team is reflected in the final statement. This can be viewed on the WSUMC website at wsmethodist.org.

On March 17, a successful initial hybrid (in person and Zoom) Friday Unwind at Indah Coffee was held. This event is hosted by Reformation Lutheran, and WSUMC, and St. Mark UMC are co-hosts. Roughly 17 individuals (both LGBTQIA+ and allies) attended in person. One individual joined remotely. These events have been held virtually for several years, and attendance has been 2-4 individuals, so the March event was considered a great success! Friday Unwinds are held on the 3rd Friday of each month at Indah Coffee in downtown Columbia.

The Celebrating our Allies Event is scheduled for May 24 at WSUMC. The event will feature speakers Nancy Malcom and AJ Ramirez, sociologists, professors, and authors who have researched the topic of LGBTQIA+ and the Methodist church. There will be dinner and a program (see more on the front page). Make plans to reserve a space today!

Several educational topics will be discussed in small groups

with members of St. Mark UMC, as well as Reformation Lutheran, starting in June. Details to come.

Missions

The missions team partnered with Active Faith to provide bags for Richland County Dept. of Social Services Foster Care program. In addition to purchasing bags for children, a community Drive 'n Drop was held on April 28 and April 29 to collect needed supplies.

The team voted to expand support for Cooperative Ministry to include an annual financial contribution of \$1000. The team will continue to purchase shelf-stable milk for Cooperative Ministry's food pantry.

Members of the team celebrated the support they have provided over the past 12 months to a local refugee family. This ministry, known as the Circle of Welcome, was accomplished in partnership with Lutheran Family Services. The missions team members are currently assessing the possibility of future partnerships like this.

Active Faith

The team recently completed a successful clothing drive for the First Year Teacher Closet and the clothing closet at Columbia College. It also partnered with Missions to provide the bags for the Richland County Dept. of Social Services Foster Care program.

Active Faith is actively working on the May 6 concert, a Musical Voyage with the String Time Duo. This is a fundraising event for the people of Ukraine (proceeds will be divided between UMCOR and Charlotte for Ukraine.) Sponsorships from Sunday School classes, individuals, etc. are being secured. The event is free to attend but donations and love offerings are encouraged. A communications plan is in process to reach the community outside of WSUMC. One such action is a billboard on Main and Elmwood which features the concert on its rotation.

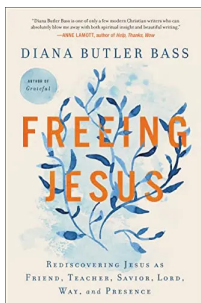
