We started the day with a delightful soup and sandwich lunch in Threatt Hall, followed by a beautiful Ash Wednesday service in Christ Chapel. Throughout Lent, join us every Wednesday from 11:45 am to 12:25 pm for a nourishing soup and sandwich lunch. Our midday services, held in Christ Chapel, commence at 12:30 p.m. Additionally, a special service led by WSUMC Youth takes place at 6:00 p.m. in Christ Chapel.

Starting on Wednesday, Feb. 21, the WSUMC Players will be presenting monologues inspired by characters from the Bible at the Lenten Lunch services. Getting to Know... Catherine Stapleton Nance

he most important thing about Washington Street, according to Dr. Catherine Nance, is the joy.

"It's a very joyful place," our new director of music said.

Three times, in particular, seem to have been Catherine's most joyful times at Washington Street.

In 1991, Catherine had a career in opera and musical theater in New York City. Among other productions, she played Susanna in Mozart's "The Marriage of Figaro" and toured France as Maria in "West Side Story." She had married a fellow musician who died of cancer after a short illness.

In December 1992, Catherine made a visit to Columbia, where her father, Dr. John Stapleton, was the senior minister at Washington Street.

At the Christmas Eve service, she sang "O Holy Night."

"I had put it out to God: I really would like to meet someone in church," Catherine said recently.

Tom Nance, who grew up attending Washington Street, asked his mother Laurely Nance to introduce them. They started dating.

After the holidays, Catherine went back to New York, and she and Tom dated long distance for a while, but in May she came back to Columbia and sublet her apartment in New York.

After living in New York for 13 years, Catherine decided to marry Tom and move back to South Carolina.

They married on Dec. 10, 1993, in the sanctuary at Washington Street. Officiating were Catherine's father and the Rev. Toni White, who had worked with the youth when Tom was growing up. John Stapleton had also been Toni's mentor during his time as her pastor at First UMC Easley, Toni's home church. Catherine said her 5-year-old nephew "reluctantly" walked her down the aisle.

Another joyful period began for Catherine. She was a paid soloist in the sanctuary choir "where (choir director) Arletta Raley was a big part of my life," she said, adding that Arletta was her mentor and her inspiration. All the while, Catherine and Tom lived in Aiken, about 30 miles from his job at the Savannah River Site, and commuted to Washington Street for choir events.

Catherine taught voice and music appreciation at USC Aiken, which served her well while her children were little.

Catherine and Tom's first child was born in 1995. They named him John Luke after both grandfathers (John Stapleton and Luke Nance). Today, John Luke is married and



is communications director for an engineering firm in Aiken. He also plays bass for his church there.

Their daughter was born in 1996. They named her Sophia Catherine Nance. That is the name of a 28-year-old woman who died in 1853 and is buried under the church. Her coffin has a window so those who loved her could admire her beauty whenever they wanted. Through the years, many of the church's young people made the subterranean trip on their hands and knees to view Sophia's face.

So did the Nances name their daughter after the woman under the church?

"I loved the name Sophia always," Catherine said. "When I heard the name of the woman under the church 'Sophia Catherine Nance,' I thought it was meant to be."

Today Sophia works as an emergency room doctor at UCLA.

In 2001, Catherine became director of music ministry at St. John UMC-Aiken. Her first Sunday was September 9, 2001, two days before 9/11, "an abrupt beginning to my time there," she said.

About a decade ago, Catherine began work on a doctorate in worship studies from the Institute of Worship Studies in Jacksonville, Florida. The program involves two weeks of intensive studies at the school twice each year plus quality distance learning.

"It has opened my eyes to many different ways people are transformed by the worship experience," Catherine said. "It has helped me to concentrate on the reasons we worship, how we might make the choices we make, and to answer the questions surrounding the overarching theme of 'why' we worship. The approach explores historical case studies, biblical origins, and theological foundations to the area of worship."

In planning music for a worship service, Catherine said she starts with a sermon plan, if one is available.

"I read the Scripture, and I do my best to develop music that supports it," Catherine said, adding that that includes hymn selection.

Catherine received her Ph.D. in 2019 and she remains a teaching assistant and a part-time member of the admissions and enrollment team for IWS.

Catherine has entered another joyful period of her life at Washington Street. Having resigned from St. John's after serving there for 21 years, she and Tom visited Washington Street one Sunday morning. That day she told senior minister Becky Shirley she would be interested in interim work if Becky knew of any. A couple of weeks later, Catherine became our church's interim choir director, and several months after that, she became permanent.

Catherine said her favorite thing in the world is to work with the choir.

"It's what God most wanted for me," she said. "I think when we do what God most wants for us, we're the most joyful."

Catherine spends a lot of time on the road, most often listening to a book on tape – a recent favorite was "Lessons in Chemistry" by Bonnie Garmus. It takes

an hour "door to door" to make the trip between Aiken and Columbia. Their home in Aiken also is two blocks from the home to which her parents retired.

In 1999, Catherine and Tom bought a historic home in downtown Aiken. The three-story, four-bedroom house with a wraparound porch was built in 1895. Their renovation is taking longer than expected because the contractor discovered extensive fire damage. Now the completion date is likely to be next September.

On their 30th wedding anniversary, Catherine and Tom, who sings bass in the choir, had lunch between the 11 a.m. worship service and rehearsal for the Sing-Along Messiah. The restaurant they chose was California Dreaming, where they had had their first date.




