National Gun Violence Awareness Day is June 9 Wear Orange to show your support!

On Sunday, June 9, we're encouraging Washington Streeters to wear orange to church to show their support for National Gun Violence Awareness Day. This first full weekend in June has been designated by Moms Demand Action for Gun Sense in America, a national group dedicated to gun safety, as a time for the community to come together and demonstrate our collective power in addressing gun violence. This year marks the 10th year the group has taken such action.

There are three ways you can act to bring the importance of firearm safety and anti-violence to the forefront during Wear Orange to End Gun Violence weekend, June 7-9:

1. **Wear Orange:** Please consider wearing orange that weekend, especially to Washington Street's Sunday Service on June 9.

2. Attend the "**BE SMART Presentation**" on Sunday, June 9, at 9:45 a.m. There will be a presentation in the chapel by BE SMART, an educational campaign on gun safety. All Sunday School classes are invited to attend in lieu of their regular class that Sunday.

This program is designed to encourage adults to safely store and handle firearms. As parents and grandparents, it's crucial to know where our young ones are in relation to our own guns, as well as the guns stored in our children's friends' houses. The role gun storage plays in suicide prevention will also be emphasized. You will learn how to identify political candidates who support legislation promoting gun safety. There are steps we can all take to raise and support our personal stances on the role of guns in our society. This program is highly engaging and informative. There will be a Q&A session and time to review useful written materials. The session will end in time to attend the 11:00 a.m. service.

Why Orange?

On January 21, 2013, Hadiya Pendleton marched in President Obama's second inaugural parade. One week later, Hadiya was shot and killed on a playground in Chicago. Soon after this tragedy, Hadiya's friends commemorated her life by wearing orange, the color hunters wear in the woods to protect themselves and others. Wear Orange is now observed every June. Thousands of people wear the color orange to honor Hadiya and the more than 43,000 Americans who are killed with guns and the approximately 76,000 more who are shot and wounded every year.

3. **Join the "Wear Orange Walk":** Mark your calendars for **Saturday, June 8**. Wear orange and participate in the "Wear Orange Walk." If you're a member of Sole-Mates (Washington Street's walking/running/hiking group), or just love to walk, we would especially love for you to take part in this opportunity to gather with us and with other individuals for a one-mile walk between two nearby downtown churches for a good cause. The walk will begin at 9:00 a.m. at Antioch Baptist Church, and conclude at Bethlehem Baptist Church, where there will be a community unity celebration.

The National Gun Violence Awareness programs during the weekend of June 7 are being conducted so that we, as concerned citizens, can learn actions to reduce gun violence in our community. We often feel there's little we can do. It's hoped you leave these programs realizing you can make a difference.

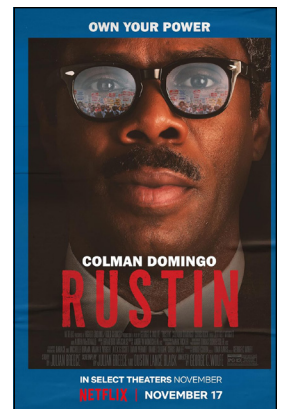

This summer, we'll be watching and discussing movies centered around individuals who confronted discrimination. We'll delve into the obstacles they encountered, how they endeavored to overcome them, whether they succeeded, and whether their actions made a lasting impact for future generations. We invite you to join us at 7:00 pm in the Wesley room or on Zoom for these discussions. All movies are available on Netflix.

June 24 - "Race"—Based on the story of Jesse Owens, the athletic superstar



whose quest to become the greatest track and field athlete in history propels him onto the world stage of the 1936 Olympics, where he confronts Adolf Hitler's vision of Aryan supremacy.

July 22 - "Shirley"—Based on the story of Shirley Chisholm, who made a groundbreaking bid for the 1972 Democratic presidential nomination after becoming the first Black woman elected to Congress.

August 26 - "Rustin"—Based on the story of Bayard Rustin, the mastermind behind the 1963 March on Washington. Rustin challenged authority unapologetically and, despite his historic contributions, was often overlooked. "Rustin" sheds light on the man who, alongside Martin Luther King Jr., dared to envision a different world and sparked a movement.
