An Open Invitation

In the gospel according to Luke, Jesus began his public life by reading a passage from Isaiah that introduced his ministry with these words: 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of God's favour.' (Luke 4:18-19)

As disciples of Jesus Christ, we are called to continue Christ's mission in the world. Therefore since the early days of Christianity, His followers have been known for their countercultural commitment to equality and care for the marginalized. From the abolition of slavery to the civil rights movement, faith communities have often led the charge for social change with a commitment to the inherent worth of every human being. Washington Street UMC in particular has a long history of faithfully serving as Christ's hands and feet by standing up for the marginalized in our society. Over the years, this congregation has been a champion of women's rights, civil rights, LGBTQIA+ rights and has worked to help those who are homeless have a satisfying meal and those who are refugees find shelter and a home.

For the past several years, members of the Racial Justice Action Team (RJAT) and the Reconciling Next Team (RNT) have taken a lead role in planning and organizing our ministries of justice and advocacy. However, as we witness the world becoming increasingly divided by race, gender, politics, and socioeconomic status, we believe that merging these two distinct teams into a single Social Justice Action Team (SJAT) we will enable us to offer clear visible support and more opportunities for active engagement in the broad range of peace and justice issues facing us today.

In these challenging times, we are reminded that we are all called to be the "salt of the earth" and "light of the world" (Mt 5:13-16). This call was given by Jesus to every believer, thus in our pursuit of justice and peace, we are inviting everyone to attend an Advocacy 101 training on January 6, 2025, at 6:00 in Threatt Hall. The new SJAT is hosting this event. A light meal will precede the training at 5:30pm and the training session will be led by members of the Faith and Justice Table of the ACLU of SC. In this training, you will learn more about the SJAT, what it means to be an advocate, how a bill becomes law in South Carolina; how to navigate the State House website to find information about legislation, and ways to interact with our State Legislators to advocate for peace and justice. Advocating for change from leaders, institutions and systems that operate contrary to the teaching of Jesus is a vital part of Christian discipleship because for Jesus "love" is a verb. Thus, to love our neighbors means we will seek to serve, care, and advocate for the good of all of God's children. We hope you will join us for this training event and in continually praying for God's kingdom to come to earth as it is in heaven.
