## Monday, January 6, 5:30 pm - Advocacy 101 Training

In the gospel according to Luke, Jesus began his public life by reading a passage from Isaiah that introduced his ministry with these words: 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of God's favour.' (Luke 4:18-19)

As disciples of Christ, we follow in Jesus's way of life carrying forward his ministry of peace, justice, and service. Thus in our pursuit of justice and peace, we are inviting everyone to join us for an Advocacy 101 training on January 6, 2025. A light meal will precede the training at 5:30pm.
