Stewardship 2025 Update










The Church Council is the highest decision-making body at Washington Street United Methodist Church. It is composed of church members and staff that give oversight and direction to the administrative ministries of the church, including Discipleship Ministries, Trustees, Finance, and Staff-Pastor-Parish Relations (SPPRC). A Lay Leader who serves as a representative of the laity and liaison for the various discipleship ministries as well as two "at large" lay members also serve as members of the Council.

These leaders are prayerfully discerned and nominated by the Committee on Lay Leadership (CLL). This team itself is an elected group whose members are selected using the same process of prayerful discernment each year.

Each Fall, our District Superintendent visits each congregation in the district to hold a "charge conference". As part of this meeting, the slate of nominated leaders developed by the CLL is printed and distributed to all in attendance. The conference is opened for discussion and the naming of new nominees from the floor before a vote is taken to officially elect the nominated leadership team.



WSUMC 2025 LAY **LEADERSHP**

In addition to electing members to serve on the Church Council, WSUMC's nominee list also includes members to be elected to serve on the various ministry and administrative teams. The term of service for each lay leadership position is typically 3 years with terms of service beginning in January of each calendar year. We post the names of current Church Council and committee members on the church website year-round as a reference for all church members.

As the following members who are serving in leadership positions this year begin their work together, they ask that you pray with them and for them. You are welcomed to attend any of their meetings, with the exception of the CLL and SPPRC. Valentines & Chocolates


You have the opportunity to purchase handmade Valentines and fair trade chocolates on Sunday, February 2 and Sunday, February 9. Mary's Maidens will be selling these items before and after Sunday School and after the worship service. All proceeds from the sale will be used for Mary's Maidens service projects.

Mary's Maidens participants are some of WSUMC's school age girls who have been hard at work making Valentines and packaging the mini chocolates for the sale. The chocolate bars and minis are made from fair trade chocolate.

Why fair trade chocolates? At a meeting over 10 years ago, we learned about the treatment of young boys forced to pick the cacao beans in Ghana and Cote d'Ivoire. The girls decided to sell chocolate bars to help. The chocolate we sell is produced from cacao beans grown in Central and South America by small family farmers and sold through Equal Exchange.
