# Our Journey Through Lent

Lent is the 40-day season of preparing our hearts for the amazing good news of the Resurrection. It begins on Ash Wednesday, which this year will be March 5th. The word "Lent" comes from the Old English word "lecten", which means "lengthen". As the days grow longer signs of Spring begin to emerge: longer and warmer days, birds singing, tender shoots of green emerge and flowers begin to bud and bloom. It's as if all creation is preparing for new life, rejoicing all together in the promise of God's ever-growing and ever-regenerating love.

Traditionally, for many followers of Jesus, Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. Today, the focus of the season is often on relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves. We often choose at this season to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others.

#### Ash Wednesday Worship in the Chapel March 5 12:30 -1:00

Ash Wednesday offers us the invitation to 'repent" - which means to intentionally turn back to God. We all find ourselves needing to turn back to God many times a day in ways small and large. It is not a matter of guilt, and it is not a shameful thing. It is simply that we realize we are not yet all that God has called us to be. During the service, Rev. Becky and Rev. Alston will mark our foreheads with ashes in the sign of a cross as a reminder of our need to repent.

### Worship in the Chapel ● March 12 - April 9 ● 12:30 -1:00

Under the direction of Larry Hembree, members of the Washington Street UMC Drama ministry will present a series of Lenten dramas pairing two characters each week from the story of Jesus' Passion who will bear witness to what they saw, heard, and felt. The dramas were written by two Lutheran Pastors, Rev. Jeff Cottingham and Dr. Amy C. Little and combined in a series entitled "The Power of Lent". Each pair of biblical characters reflects upon a similar theme for the week, showing how the same events brought about very different reactions to Jesus and his identity. Our ministers will lead the services each week sharing scripture and prayer to introduce the dramas. Our music staff and some of our talented soloists will add their talents to these services helping us all experience the "Power of Lent."

# Art Projects to Enhance our Lenten Journey

The Worship Team has joined up with seamstresses from Tabitha's Table and WS artist Wayne Hall to create two art projects to enhance our journey through the 40 days of Lent.

#### **Lenten Cross**

In keeping with the sermon, series leading up to Lent, "Unleashing Hope", Rev Becky asked those present at the worship service on February 16th to write down one word that conjures up sentiments of hope. Wayne has designed a large cross that will use these words of hope etched into 40 blocks of wood, forming the spine of the cross. For the arm of the cross, Wayne will create a shadow box depicting aspects of Jesus' life. This cross will be displayed in the sanctuary throughout Lent.

#### Lenten Banner

During the coming weeks, Washington Streeters will be asked to write a brief prayer on a precut strip of ribbon. These ribbons will be collected, sewn and woven, and bound into a banner by the members of Tabitha's Table Sewing Group. It will be presented during the Palm Sunday service.
