# **ECUADOR MISSION TRIP 2025**

It's always amazing to see members of Washington Street doing good in our local community. But it's a special kind of pride to see them do good in another part of the world. On June 4th, 16 total members of local United Methodist Churches, including Washington Street, traveled to Ecuador to bring medical and spiritual care to those in need. This mission trip is an annual event that was started many years ago by Rev. Patricia Parrish and missionary Sarah Flores.

During their 10 days in Ecuador, the travelers brought help to five different communities and provided medical assistance to those who would otherwise go without. There was a dentist, optometrist, pediatrician, and a triage physician to make sure the residents had a clean bill of health. The rest of the travelers without a background in medical care assisted where they could to make sure the Ecuadorian people felt at ease. By the end of their trip, these amazing volunteers had provided dental care to 110 people, prescribed glasses to 500 people, and gave general medical care to over 600 people.

Medical Kits, filled with supplies donated by members of our very church, were given out to the clinic patients as well. By the end of the trip, too many were given out to count! The Ecuador mission team also helped out with church related duties. They assisted with a local Vacation Bible School program, held service on Pentecost Sunday, and preached the word of God in both English and Spanish to show respect for the Ecuadorian culture. Though one attendee, Melanie Dobson, would point out that this trip wasn't about bringing Christ to the people of Ecuador. It was about seeing Christ in those they were able to help.

Those interested in learning more about this year's trip, and how to participate in future trips, should join us in the sanctuary on August 10<sup>th</sup>. This will be a special service hosted by Melanie Dobson and will focus on this year's Ecuador mission trip and the good that was done during it.





## **Vacation Bible School 2025**


