Just as our Ecuador travelers were returning from their trip, another group was setting out to make a change in a different part of the world. From June 14th to the 21^{st,} a group of volunteers from Washington

Street traveled to St. Helena Island, SC to participate in Salkehatchie Summer Service. During their week of worship and togetherness they made renovations to five local homes that were in desperate need of repairs. Even when it was time to go home, these dedicated volunteers decided to stay past

their required time until the job was complete.

It's amazing to see members of our congregation do good in various parts of the world. But there were also great things being done at home as well. At the end of July, we hosted our annual Vacation Bible School program which brought together 20 children from our local community for a week of learning, fun and devotion. Between singing songs and hanging out with the VBS mascot Scout, our kids learned a very important lesson from Joshua 1:9: "I hereby command you: Be strong and courageous; do not be frightened or dismayed, for the LORD your God is with you wherever you go." 
