More than 30 years ago, what is now know as the Christ Chapel Courtyard was little more than a storage space for old tools and the church's trash cans. However, Janet Cotter saw the potential beauty in this space and knew it could be something more. Despite being told that the church couldn't afford to make the renovations necessary, Janet was able to not only raise the money herself, but also recruit a number of volunteers to help her. Through their efforts, Janet and her team were able to gather the parts needed to



complete her noble vision. This required driving all around the state in search of the perfect fountain, finding someone to lay the Regency Red bricks with Arial font engravings, and finding a way to get trimmings from John Wesley's England home through customs to plant them in our courtyard. Because of their non-stop dedication, Washington Street UMC now has a beautiful, meditative space that is open to all who enter our building. Janet's team of helpers would eventually become the Christ Chapel Courtyard Committee; A group dedicated to the upkeep of the

courtyard and who make sure it still fits Janet's initial vision all these years later. Through this committee, church donors can contribute to the courtyard maintenance fund and in return receive a brick engraved in recognition of their contribution.

On September 14th, the Christ Chapel Courtyard Committee held a special "blessing of the bricks" ceremony to honor and celebrate those who have contributed to our courtyard. Rev. Becky hosted the ceremony in Christ Chapel just after Sunday service, where many Washington Street members were in attendance. Rev.

Becky then led the attendees into the Christ Chapel Courtyard where she asked God to bless this holy space, so it may continue to be a place where we can feel his love. 


Filled with familiar hymns, an interactive Jesus story, and communion, this service is especially friendly to persons living with dementia and their care partners.
