## Sing-Along Messiah 2025

In 1741, George Frideric Handel composed Handel's *Messiah* in just 24 days with text compiled from the King James Bible. Despite an average reception after its debut performance in April of 1742, Handel's work would become increasingly popular and is now one of the most frequently performed choral works in all of Western music. *Messiah* tells the full story of Jesus Christ from the prophets announcing his coming birth to his crucifixion and ascension into heaven. As we prepare to celebrate Christ's birth, Handel's most treasured work

is a great reminder of what the Advent Season is truly about. And nearly 300 years after its completion, we are happy to be able to bring *Messiah* to life right here at Washington Street United Methodist Church.

Many years ago, former WSUMC music director Arletta Raley had a chance encounter with Dr. Lillian Quackenbush while the two were attending a New York City choral director's convention. This meeting of the minds would result in the creation of the annual Sing-Along *Messiah* performance. A showing of Handel's *Messiah* that is open to everyone and encourages the audience to sing along with the performers.

Every year since 2002, our music program has put on Sing-Along *Messiah* with the help of local musicians, singers, and music programs willing to contribute instruments, time and talent. We also would like to thank our

amazing Sing-Along *Messiah* committee who works tirelessly year after year to make sure the performance goes off without a hitch.

This year's show will be in the Washington Street Sanctuary on December 15<sup>th</sup> at 7 pm. Tickets are free but are first come, first served. Doors open at 6 pm so be sure to get here early to secure your seats!

This showing of S.A.M will be dedicated to Arletta, who tragically passed away on July 10<sup>th</sup>, 2025. She spent over 30 years as music director at WSUMC and had a long and fruitful career as a music educator outside of the church. Arletta was born to make music, and we are very blessed she chose to do so here at Washington Street. While we miss her dearly, we will use this year's Sing-Along *Messiah* to celebrate her creative spirit and love of music and we hope that you all will do the same.

We hope to see you all on December 15<sup>th</sup>, and look forward to singing through the story of Christ as a united congregation.

#### **WSUMC Library Now Open**

Starting in December 2025, the WSUMC Library will be open daily from 9 am until 4 pm. While there will be library assistants available on most days, you are also free to explore the library by yourself. The near 3000 books in our library are catalogued on the Librarika system which you will need to be registered with in order to borrow books. If you are in our REALM system you will soon receive an email message from Librarika entitled "Invitation to join the Washington Street UMC Library." Joining is very easy; you just need to click on the link given in the email and follow the instructions. Once you have joined, you will be able to search the online library system. Non-WSUMC members may join too but they will need to register directly with one of the library assistants.

You may also borrow books by using the sign-out sheet located in the library. Please be sure to follow the instructions so all books are accounted for. The books are catalogued according to a word-system that is based on the Dewey-Decimal system, but uses word categories. The shelves are all marked with the various categories, but like in the Dewey-Decimal system there may be some overlaps.

#### **Volunteer Tax Preparers Needed!**

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program has been an invaluable service provided by The Cooperative Ministry that offers services to individuals and families with low to moderate incomes who are eligible for tax credits. Since 2010, the local program has prepared over 70,000 tax returns for families with young children, senior adults, those with disabilities, and many more, resulting in refunds of more than \$88 million. These refunds are distributed directly to families, enabling them to pay bills and save for the future. Entering its sixteenth year of service, The Cooperative Ministry needs 40 additional volunteers for the 2026 tax season. A commitment of three to four hours per week is desired. There are 10 convenient VITA site locations throughout the Columbia area, offering a flexible schedule that includes weekdays, evenings, and weekends. No experience is required, and some VITA volunteer opportunities don't involve preparing taxes. WSUMC member, Cindy Cox, has been a VITA volunteer for many years. "I find the experience rewarding. Clients are incredibly appreciative and Cooperative Ministry staff provides effective training and support. It's fulfilling to be part of a team that empowers our community by bringing them important financial resources."


#### **Be Cautious of Scam E-Mails!**
