## Operation Inasmuch

Following Jesus's teachings that "Inasmuch we serve others, we serve him." (Matthew 25:40), many members of Washington Street spent time during Martin Luther King Jr. weekend volunteering with local non-profits across the Columbia Area. During this weekend, we collected donations of various hygiene and clothing items for the Lutheran Services Carolina's New Americans Program. The LCS helps recent refugees get established in America, many of whom come to this county with little to no personal items. Thanks to the generosity of our congregation, we were able to completely fill one of LCS's empty closets which has allowed them to help new refugees as soon as they come in. We also partnered with Senior Resources, an organization dedicated to helping the elderly live independent lives, to deliver pet food to local seniors who are unable to leave their homes for an extended period of time.

On Saturday our volunteers assisted serving food to those in our community who needed a good meal. In the morning, UofSC's Methodist Student Network served breakfast to over 100 unhoused individuals while volunteers handed out hygiene items and hand/feet warmers. Later that evening, volunteers cooked dinner for families staying at the local Ronald McDonald house whose children were staying in nearby hospitals.

Before and after service on Sunday, church attendees were encouraged to write letters to our legislators to share wishes and prayers for the new legislative season. Members of Washington Street staff also visited the SC Statehouse to deliver prayer crosses in person to legislators on their first day back in office.

As the weekend came to an end on Monday, our volunteers were invited to clean up two Columbia rivers by local environmental groups. First location was the Congaree Swamp Litter Pick Up which was hosted by Friends of

Congaree Swamp in partnership with Keep the Midlands Beautiful. The second was the Saluda Riverwalk Invasive Species and Litter Cleanup. Volunteers not only helped dispose of trash and invasive species to the area, but also got to take place in a short stroll through nature along the boardwalk.

Helping out with any of these opportunities was not only a great way to serve the community, but it was also an amazing way to grow closer together as a congregation while spreading the love of God. Thank you to all who volunteered and our event organizers Cindy Cox, Jim Lane, Lynn Shirley, and Andrea McAtee.




## Shrove Tuesday Pancakes




